



•BURGLARIES:

At the time of writing this article (9/12/16), there continues to be a problem of burglaries occurring in the Northwick Park area. The burglaries are sporadic but no doubt it does appear that the area is being targeted as the burglary numbers are up.

We believe that there are at least two sets of burglar groups going around of various descriptions – mixed ethnicities.

Police have identified at least one of these burglars and efforts are being made to arrest him.

We have had some brilliant information from residents who have witnessed burglars fleeing in getaway cars and other information on sightings of suspicious persons. All this information we value, and resources permitting, we follow up on but, please understand that, sometimes it is not possible to follow up on this information at the time of your call to police.

We urge you as residents to be vigilant and on the lookout for any suspicious behaviour/ suspicious cars - are there persons loitering around, looking into houses, knocking on doors, looking suspicious/shifty??

Report any suspicious sightings on 101 or anyone who you believe to be in the commission of a burglary on 999.

Your team is out on the patch doing patrols in unmarked police cars in an effort to try to catch these burglars.

•COLD CALLERS AND DISTRACTION BURGLARS:

I know I go on about this again and again, but the issue of cold callers in person and by telephone is an ever present problem – I get a lot of phone calls from residents reporting this activity so please really scrutinise who is knocking on your door or ringing you on the phone.

Cold callers or strangers at your doorstep - do not, under any circumstance, admit them to your house or disclose any information to them, only partially open the door and leave the chain lock on. Ask them what they want and their name. Review their ID card if they have one, take a note of any details given. I would urge you not to let anyone into your house unless you are 100% sure of their genuineness. I would also urge you not to engage with anyone at the doorstep that is trying to sell you a product or service – it is a recipe for disaster!.

In early December I had phone calls from residents who had cold callers at their doorstep asking them whether they wanted any roofing or guttering work done. I made enquiries into the company name they used and individuals connected to it and found that persons quoting the same company name and details, had previously been arrested for fraud by eliciting residents (elderly) to get unnecessary building work done. Do not engage with any cold callers trying to sell you a product or service.

Really scrutinise who is knocking on your door, if you know of an elderly resident ensure that they have a strong chain lock fitted and urge that they use it.

Be suspicious of any unknown person who calls at your address, especially if you are elderly – DO NOT ALLOW THEM INTO YOUR ADDRESS.

Cold callers or strangers on the telephone – Many residents have received phone calls from persons claiming to be from the HMRC – one woman was defrauded of money following a telephone call claiming to be from the HMRC. Other calls received by residents are from persons purporting to be from the Ministry of Transport, the Apple store and even the police. Another resident has received a text on his mobile claiming that he had won a lottery or cash, in his instance the name used was FURO-MEGA DRAW

Please please please do not respond to these calls, or emails or text.

Do NOT disclose any personal details or bank details if you receive any phone calls or any one at your front door.

• THEFT SCAM:

Theft from car scam - LITTLETON RD -8/12/16 at about 1245hrs. An elderly resident driving her car on LITTLETON ROAD had a car behind hers continually sounding it's horn and male occupants trying to alert her. The woman stopped her car, believing these persons to be genuine, and the driver of the other car, indicated that there might underneath be something stuck her car. Whilst she was looking at the back of her car, the passenger of this other vehicle rushed passed her and stole her handbag from her car. Please be aware of this ploy/ scam, and do not get out of your vehicle unless you are sure that you have been involved in an accident. If you do get out, make sure that you immediately lock your car after you exit it and approach any strangers with utmost caution. Please make your elderly family members or local residents aware of this scam. Again some personal safety advice is also available on the Met Police Website www.met.police.uk - it is under the 'Advice' heading.

A councillor's primary role is to represent their ward and the people who live in it. Councillors provide a bridge between the community and the council. If you want our help, just ask.

Byron Court School Expansion Works -As I have stated previously, the second stage of the rebuilding and expansion of Byron Court School was due to start in October 2016 but at the time of writing nothing has happened. Interestingly, three school expansions contract decisions, including Byron Court, are due to be discussed at Brent Council's Cabinet on the 12th December for a decision regarding "Update on Design and Build Contracts". What the recommendations in these papers are, is currently a mystery as they are "Restricted" for "Financial" reasons. I have met with a very senior council officer and from what he has told me. I believe the decision to restrict is the correct one. Unfortunately the Courier copy date is before the Cabinet meeting.

More about Schools - One of the major concerns for residents relating to the expansions of Wemblev High and Byron Court centred on road safety. Unfortunately I have two road safety events to update you on: At the end of November, three children were injured by a motor vehicle while on the pavement across the road from Sudbury Primary (see Kilburn Times). The second event happened on Sudbury Court Drive very near to the Tuition School at number 116 on Saturday 3rd December at around 3pm where a lady was run over outside her house. Here is a statement from her son:

"The car came on to the driveway of 108 knocking her down, she fell on the bonnet before hitting the pavement and is still in hospital having undergone knee surgery amongst several other injuries including fractured ankle, bruising to the ribs and chest and black eves from the fall. The car in question had children in it and swiftly drove off without stopping. The injured lady screamed to another woman parked in front of a neighbour's driveway to knock on the door of 108 for help. She did before leaving without giving her name."

This event is extremely disturbing; if you witnessed the event or have any information about it, PLEASE, contact myself or the Police.

CCTV cars near The Green - A resident recently asked me about the CCTV cars that can often be seen parked on vellow lines in the vicinity of The Green and why they are allowed to do so. These CCTV cars are monitoring both the illegal "U Turns" on Watford Road and the "No Right Turns" in and out of The Green. I have spoken to the CCTV operators and they assure me that they only park on the yellows (for which they have dispensation) when there is nowhere else to park. The deployment of these CCTV cars is still necessary as a deterrent, on one afternoon this week, during a one hour period; six cars were seen to perform illegal "U Turns" in the bell-mouth of Pebworth Road. Users of this junction will testify how very dangerous these manoeuvres are. It is planned to narrow the bell-mouth in the coming months to deter these manoeuvres.

It had been suggested by the Council that a traffic island be placed in Watford Road to stop the illegal right turns at The Green, however, some local residents who were consulted pointed out that this would be extremely inconvenient for those living in houses opposite the island and it will not now be installed.

John Lyon Roundabout - We have all noticed that this roundabout is often blocked by queuing traffic from Sudbury Court Drive and northbound along Watford Road with much aggression being shown by drivers. The effect is to stop traffic from accessing the unblocked exits of the roundabout; this congestion has tempted some drivers to make very dangerous manoeuvres such as driving on the wrong side of the road.

It is intended to install white lines on the roundabout in attempt to make traffic move to the outside of the roundabout and release the traffic which should then be able enter the unblocked exits unhindered. We will see if it works.

Footway Parking - Please remember that parking on the pavements, except in exempted streets, is illegal in London. This practice is dangerous and causes damage to the pavements etc. This practice is happening more and more and is now having to be enforced. If you park on the footway, dropped kerb or grass verge at any time of the day or night, do not be surprised if you get a ticket, you may even get towed away as a half dozen locals have experienced already this year.

Christmas trees - subscribers to the garden waste service will be able to use their green bin to dispose of their tree (remember to make sure it all fits within the bin). Residents may also take their trees to the Household Reuse & Recycling Centre at Abbey Road. This year for the first time there will also be a drop off point in a local park or green space in January. Look out for the promotion of our local site and dispose of your tree responsibly.

Harrow School Footpath Diversions - Harrow School have made an application to divert two Public Footpaths crossing their grounds; they are FP57 Pebworth Road to Football Lane and FP58 The Ducker Cross-Watford Road ina Lane. These are historic routes which have been referred to as Coffin Roads and probably date back to the building of St Mary's on Harrow Hill in 1087 and maybe before that as a Pagan site. Currently they cross Harrow School Grounds as straight routes. Since the School started installing permanent pitches across their estate including designated farm land, they have encroached severely on the footpath network and, for their benefit, they have applied to divert the footpaths along longer circuitous routes that are less convenient for footpath users. The footpaths have already been obstructed with fencing, and walkers are further deterred by intimidatory signage, tapes and security staff.

The applications to divert the footpaths is going to Planning Enquiry on 17th January



2017, if you use these footpaths and wish to object to their diversion, please contact me on 07711 561 848, or by email keith@keithperrin.co.uk. I'm looking to collect as many personal letters from footpath users that state that they use the footpaths as direct routes and do not wish them to be diverted onto less convenient routes.

And Finally - Many of us are aware of an increased crime rate in the area. I have spoken to the Police who have assured me they are doing all they can and they have drafted in extra resources - I have seen evidence of these extra resources while travelling around the area on a regular basis. I believe that some of the offenders have now been arrested and some suspects are well and truly on the Police radar. I'm sure that the SNT report will say a lot more and that this spike will soon be over.

Are you worried about your memory? PART III

We have been writing about memory and helping to tell the difference between normal ageing and onset of dementia or "cognitive decline"

Do you get lost? Of course we all get lost, not just thanks to the Sat Nav misdirecting us. But do you get lost in familiar places, you might be suddenly uncertain if you come to a road where there is a new set of traffic lights, or a new building or shop has appeared.? You might get disorientated when driving in a familiar place in the dark. You may pause to get your direction.... but you won't get lost. Someone with dementia gets lost and disorientated even in familiar places and is unable to follow directions. It is no good telling somebody with dementia to go right at the bottom of the road and then second left, they really won't be able to follow the chain of instruction

Do you remember the lady I talked about in last month's Courier, the one who bought the same yellow shoes twice? That choice of those lovely yellow shoes show that her decision making is unchanged and that judgement and choices are unaffected. Someone with dementia has difficulty in making choices. They can't weight up the pros and cons and someone who has previously had good judgement may begin to make poor choices. Somebody with dementia may start to behave socially in an inappropriate way. Their judgement and use of language may be affected and the politest, most courteous, gentlemanly neighbour may begin to use words which you really didn't think they would know. Have you got into trouble because you have forgotten to pay your bills? Did you have breakfast this morning? Are you wearing clothes that are appropriate for the weather? Can you


the idea of having a cold bath out in the cold garden but, for a bird, it is a real tonic.


