

#### • FLY TIPPING AND LITTER:

On 10/05/2017 a large fly tipping occurred in Aspen Drive, Elms Lane – part of Northwick Park patch. PC KENNEDY liaising with the council has conducted an investigation and found that the waste that was fly tipped there had been picked up earlier in the day from an address in Alperton:

A white male mid-late 30s/early 40s, 25+ stone, with an Irish accent, had called at the address in Alperton earlier in the day in a white Ford Transit, asked if the resident wanted waste collected, a price of £60 was agreed by the resident and this cold calling "waste collector" – the resident didn't ask to see any waste carriage licence, he took at face value that this male was going to deposit his waste correctly. Surprise, surprise this waste was fly tipped!

This resident may be prosecuted by Brent Council for not taking adequate steps to ensure that the waste was deposited correctly. If you wish to have a large amount of waste deposed of, you must take all possible measures to ensure disposable of the waste to the recycling centre.

Residents should dispose of all waste correctly, and keep their area clean. If I (PC KENNEDY) find anyone fly tipping or depositing litter on the pavement I will ensure that they are prosecuted.

Your team is working with the council to reduce fly tipping and litter on the patch. Byron Road and Peel Road are the areas where it is particularly bad, we are endeavouring to tackle this.

#### **•COLD CALLER ALERT:**

Cold calling is the term given to a stranger who calls at your address unexpectedly, touting for work. or claiming to be from a company/agency. A stranger can also cold call you on the telephone. Cold calling in person or over the telephone must always be treated with caution.

Cold calling in person: do not under any circumstance allow a cold caller into your home. I would urge you not to engage with cold callers. If you want your garden tended to, or your driveway jet washed, or your roof repaired, or whatever – make enquiries to get someone who lives locally to do the work. If you speak to your neighbours and make enquiries you should be able to find someone.

<u>Cold calling over the telephone</u>: likewise if someone you don't know calls you on the telephone out of the blue, saying that they are from your bank or the police or someone else (gas/electricity company) then please treat them with the utmost caution.

Take a name of the caller, their identity number, and their phone number or extension number. Then look up a number for their body or company in the directory or internet and then ring back on this number requesting to speak to the person in order to confirm identity.

If anyone is trying to scare you into giving money or divulging your bank details DO NOT! They are probably trying to obtain your bank details to scam you!

# RED ALERT - "GAS BOARD" COLD CALLERS!

• In a nearby area to Northwick Park an elderly woman had men calling at her address claiming to be from the "Gas Board" stating that there was a leak and they needed urgent access to her house. Fortunately, a vigilant neighbour intervened and chased these men away before they managed to take anything from her house.

In South Brent recently, there have been men burgling elderly resident's addresses by pretending to be from the council and demanding access to inspect their house.

Particularly, if you are elderly do not open your door to anyone you don't know – speak to them through the window and try to confirm their details. Ring the police if you doubt the genuineness of any person claiming to be from the police, or the council or a utility company.

# Bottom line, DO NOT ENGAGE WITH COLD CALLERS.

Over the past year, I have met burglars, fraudsters and wanted persons who have been cold calling in the Northwick Park area. I cannot emphasise how important it is not to get them to do any work for you, or enter into any agreement or arrangement with any cold caller. Please let me know if you see cold callers in the area and any leaflets that they have given to you or information you have about cold callers including vehicles registrations if you have seen or noticed any.

# OTHER SCAMS OCCURRING AROUND THE AREA:

An elderly Asian woman was approached by veiled woman (dark skinned European looking, 40s) with limited English who claimed that her mother was in hospital and wanted directions to the hospital. The veiled woman who was crying and very animated put her hands on the elderly woman claiming to be in distress and then tried to remove jewellery that the Asian woman was wearing. This scam is quite common in Summer time and the targeted victims tend to be elderly Asian women wearing gold jewellery. They are approached very closely by a distressed woman with a headscarf claiming their

mother is in hospital and then begin to touch the victim pretending that they need consoling – whilst touching the victim they manage to get off necklaces and bracelets. These scammers put on a show that is Oscar winning but keep them away from you, and don't let them approach you. If you know of any elderly persons make them aware of this scam. Elderly residents in the Northwick Park area have been victim of this in the past – one victim being approached near Oldborough Road and the other victim on the Watford Road.

#### **BURGLARS IN THE AREA:**

A number of residents have reported white males in their 20s knocking at their address during the day and when the occupier answers they door they claim to be looking for work or that they have got the wrong address. It might be if someone does this that they are checking to see if someone is in the house – this is a common ploy to check to see if someone is in.

There is no hard and fast rule to know when someone is checking to see in your house is occupied. If you have had someone call at your address in the manner described above, then look out your window to see where they go or what they are doing. Ring police if you believe that they are up to no good. Ring on 101.

Some months ago, a resident in Langham Gardens, didn't answer her doorbell but looked out the window and then saw a male looking over her gate into her back garden. He then went away when he saw her looking at him. This male was clearly up to no good. Ring us immediately if you believe that someone is checking out your house to burgle it.

\*\*\*\*In Summertime, residents need to be extra vigilant with leaving windows open. Do not leave a window open on the ground floor of your house unless you are awake and in the ground floor of your house. At nighttime, do not leave any windows open on the ground floor if you are asleep upstairs, even upstairs please only leave windows open with security restrictors on them i.e to prevent them from opening the window wide and gaining access. If you have an alarm ensure you set it at nighttime even if you are in the house\*\*\*\*

# Councillor's Comments

Noise from Building Works - Many properties have been having building work carried out during non permitted hours. Section 60 of the Control of Pollution Act 1974 stipulates that construction and demolition works and ancillary operations which are <u>audible at the site boundary</u> shall only be carried out between the hours of:

Monday to Fridays 08:00 to 18:00 Saturday 08:00 to 13:00

At no time on Sundays or Bank Holidays

Failure to comply with the above without good reason may result in a legal notice being served upon the person/company responsible. The notice will formally impose the above restrictions. In exceptional circumstances (for example, in the case of an emergency), the person responsible should contact the Nuisance Control Team as soon as possible. Failure to comply with the terms of the notice may result in prosecution and on summary conviction; the person/company responsible will be liable to an unlimited fine.

Telephone: (020) 8937 5252 Email: ens.noiseteam@brent.gov.uk Cleaner Brent App - I noticed recently that the Cleaner Brent App hasn't been working very well in that fly tips etc were not being cleared. The reason for this is that the GPS locating to addresses isn't working very well. We will update as and when this is fixed.

**Dropped Kerb Policy** - I have noticed a lot of newly paved front gardens without dropped kerbs or drainage and thought I should remind everyone of the current policy and that crossing the pavement without a dropped kerb is not allowed and can damage the utilities below the pavements.

The forecourt area must be of permeable construction; if not, planning permission will be required for non permeable areas greater than 5 square metres.

The application must comply with the soft landscaping requirements of 50% or 30% depending on the size of the frontage.

Adequate drainage must be provided to prevent surface water from spilling from the frontage onto the highway.

landscaping must be provided along the frontage not served by the crossing to within **600mm from the edge of the crossover** (which includes the taper length).

Vehicles parked on your frontage must not overhang the footway.

#### Parking on Pavements and Drop Kerbs -

This practise continues and is illegal and also makes crossing our roads difficult for pedestrians due to the resultant poor visibility. It also makes life impossible for wheelchair users and parents with babies in buggies or prams. This is why we have Zig-Zags on our Pedestrian Crossings. Please do not park on the pavements; as well as being illegal and dangerous, it risks damaging the utilities below the un-strengthened pavements.

More about One Public Estate (OPE) - The following information below has been extracted from a Government Document published February 2017 called OPE 2017 Unlocking the value of public sector assets . Although I have added some emphases, the text is taken from the document, which can be found on the web.

"Case study 10 Collaborative Regeneration - London Borough of Brent, Northwick Park.

The challenge: To bring together four landowning public sector organisations, and work with other stakeholders to rationalise services and resources, unlock development land, reduce running costs, create jobs, homes, and revenue streams, and make Northwick Park a landmark destination.

The four partners, the London Borough of Brent, London North West Healthcare NHS Trust, the University of Westminster and Network Homes Ltd all own land adjacent to each other. They are very different organisations, with different aims, governance structures and priorities. However, common themes unite them: residential accommodation requirements, reduction of running costs, increased efficiencies, opportunities for shared teaching accommodation, ground maintenance and facilities management, maximising land values, improving infrastructure, dealing with parking, provision of leisure facilities, etc.

The site has evolved in a largely piecemeal way over the years, with little interaction between the organisations. The site has enormous potential, but is essentially landlocked, with limited road access and a series of uncoordinated unattractive footpaths, and the park is isolated.

The vision: The vision of the four partners is to create a ground breaking development that complements the park and outer London setting, providing new homes in a currently land locked setting.

The project will bring in other stakeholders, such as Transport for London, Network Rail, London Borough of Harrow, Greater London Authority, with the aim of not being

The vision is to:

- bring about the anticipated delivery of over 500 new homes
- celebrate the park and integrate it with its surroundings
- develop new homes of the highest quality
- · bring in increased revenue
- create employment and skills opportunities• replace inadequate infrastructure
- · maximise land values
- · drive down operating costs
- make Northwick Park a destination of choice.

The actions: The Partnership is in its infancy and has concentrated on firming up its governance and project management arrangements. Individual and common outcomes have been agreed, property assets are being mapped out, and briefs for the main consultants are being drafted.

The outcomes: Ultimate potential outcomes of the project include:

- creation of over 500 new mixed tenure, high quality homes
- generation of capital or revenue receipts
- better service delivery
- integrated services and facilities, such as parking, and joint use of teaching facilities
- new vehicular, public transport and pedestrian routes on the site
- · joint sports and social facilities
- introduction of revenue generating commercial enterprises
- creation of a new energy centre serving the development, and selling surplus energy back to the grid
- step free access and enhanced entrance to two tube stations
- · revenue savings
- · social benefits
- stimulating economic growth by place making and an integrated master plan design
- catalyst for private sector investment in the area.

The next steps: There is still much work to do:

- a communications strategy is to be developed to ensure clear messages are being delivered and the vision is shared
- scoping documents are to be prepared and consultants selected to develop the feasibility work and establish a business case and develop proposals for service redesign.

Finally - It should also be appreciated that OPE is only a part of a public report on potential disposals of NHS land - initially focusing on "acute sites" (hospitals, generally speaking - though the "mental health estate" is also to be looked at next). London is seen as high value generator of capital, and indeed the report has as one of its purposes to "support" some high value London property sales. This review is by Sir Robert Naylor, and is of interest to us all as it highlights the "risks" to the programme of disposals as the planning process, affordable housing and "green belt" issues may get in the way. Some people might think that NHS land should not be viewed as a "development" opportunity but preserved to serve us in the future - since repurchasing for our growing populations is never going to get more "affordable" - but I could not possibly comment!

# A good night's sleep - part III

Last month we talked about some of the things we need to do in the day to ensure a good night's sleep. Here are the rest of them!

- \* I hope your life partner feels the same as you about light in the bedroom. We have very specific requirements about light, some of us need to sleep in a bedroom which is entirely blacked out, and others need the light to regulate their sleeping cycles.
- \* Consider ear plugs to stop you being woken by noise, particularly if your bedroom is near a busy road, or if your partner is a snorer or tends to wake you up coming to bed at a different time. Sadly, I find many couples sleeping apart to avoid being woken by their partner, so look for some really good ear plugs now, before losing your night time companion.
- \* Devices. This is probably the most important factor which affects sleep and which people don't realise keeps them

- awake. Anything which requires you to make a decision, even to read a message or respond to it, is keeping your (computer) brain switched on. Avoid mobile phones, tablets and computers for at least 2 hours before going to bed. The discipline of putting your phone away, switching it off, can start the wind-down process which gets you ready for bed. Remember, as soon as you look at your phone, you are moving your brain to a different level which then has to be switched down again in order to move into sleep mode.
- \* Your bedroom is for sleeping or making love. Avoid working, eating or even watching television in bed unless you use soothing television programmes to help you wind down.
- \* 2 hours before going to bed, write a list of your concerns, think about the day ahead, and consider writing a 'to do' list. Leave all those worries and tasks with the list some-

For those of you lucky enough to have **house sparrows** in your garden, they should be busy at their nests by now. They tend to be a little later getting started than many of our garden birds, but usually go on much later into September, sometimes having as many as four broods, each of 5 or more chicks! Gluttons for punishment!

Their chicks are more heavily dependent on caterpillars and juicy larger insects than the chicks of other garden birds. Unhappily, such food is in very short supvla in the summer months due to the insecticides we humans use to keep our gardens insect free and looking good. Many nests fail because the chicks cannot survive and die of hunger.

The RSPB report, below, still records the house sparrow as the top national bird, but it is in greatly reduced numbers compared to earlier years.

Gone are the days when I had over forty sparrows in the garden at fledging time. I have seen only one in the garden this year! Depressing, isn't it?

I sometimes put meat scraps out for the crows, who pounce on them with relish. But recently I put just a single scrap out on the grass. On this occasion I was very interested to see that a male blackbird was pulling strips off the meat and feeding it to his hungry fledgling.

I have never seen a blackbird taking meat before. But then I thought, "Why not? After all, cooked meat must be just as tasty as raw worms!"

#### **RSPB Garden Birdwatch**

You may have seen the results of this annual national count, which are very similar to previous years regarding the most populous species.

Nationally, the top three species were house sparrow: starling: blackbird. Each has slightly increased in number since last

year, which is encouraging. But compared to 1979, when the RSPB Garden Birdwatch started, their numbers are down by 57%: 79%: 27%, respectively. As I said above: depressing, isn't it?

As a matter of interest, in the Greater London results, the **woodpigeon** (not ferals) was top of the list, with a **1060%** increase since 1979. So I suppose that it's not all bad news.



#### Swifts' return

Well, we are still waiting for them to return! And I have to submit my copy for *Birdwatch* today 10<sup>th</sup> May, and they are still not here!

Apart from one hearing and one sighting, both recorded by Francis, that's the lot.

We must assume that the very cold start to May has delayed the **swifts** return and hope that the weather hasn't put them off entirely.

#### Recent sighting

You may remember, last month, we reported that Margaret had secured an Estate 'tick' when seeing a pair of **cormorants** flying across. I was hoping that that might get us one up over Francis for our bird watching challenge with him.

But no! He has seen one flying overhead as well! Bah!

Keep watching, folks!

# A WIN for Local Residents

A press release from the Open Spaces Society:

Local residents, backed by the Open Spaces Society, the Ramblers and the Harrow Hill Trust, have defeated plans by Harrow School to move two public footpaths across its sports pitches and tennis courts. The objectors fought the plans at a six-day public inquiry earlier this year. The government inspector, Ms Alison Lea, has now rejected the proposals.

The School wanted to move two public footpaths, officially known as numbers 57 and 58 which have for centuries run in direct lines across the land now forming part of its

grounds. Footpath 57 follows a north-south route between Football Lane and Pebworth Road. The School obstructed the footpath with sports pitches surrounded by fencing in 2003. For nine years, the School padlocked the gates across the path but reopened them following pressure from the objectors. The objectors had argued that Harrow Council should make the School reopen the path, as required by law, but instead the council agreed with the School to move the path around the obstructions. Footpath 58 runs in a direct line between the bottom of Football Lane and Watford Road, and the School applied to move it to a zigzag route to avoid the current configuration of its sports pitches.

Alison Lea refused the proposals principally because of the impact of the changes on public enjoyment, in particular the loss of views which the Harrow West MP, Gareth Thomas, called 'spectacular' in his evidence to the inquiry. The paths provide direct walking routes to Harrow-on-the-Hill with its impressive church-spire, whereas the views from the diverted routes were, the inspector said, 'unexceptional'. She also considered that the School had exaggerated the benefits of the proposed diversions.

At the public inquiry, the School was represented by a QC, assisted by a junior barrister; the Council was also legally represented, but the objectors represented themselves.

Appearing as objectors at the inquiry were Kate Ashbrook of the Open Spaces Society and Ramblers, Gareth Thomas MP, Harrow Councillor Sue Anderson, Paul Catherall of the Harrow Hill Trust, Brent Councillor Keith Perrin, and local residents including Gaynor Lloyd, Christopher Eley, and John Parker.

Others submitted written objections.

Says Kate Ashbrook, general secretary of the Open Spaces Society: 'It has taken local people 14 years of strenuous campaigning against the might of Harrow School to save these footpaths, with their splendid views and sense of purpose. 'Now we shall press the Council again to ensure that Harrow School reopens the blocked footpath 57. We shall be fortified by the inspector's decision—the Council can no longer avoid taking action to resolve this mess.'

One of the objectors said: 'As long-standing residents we can testify that the footpaths pre-date much of the local built environment. They have been actively used by local people to reach St Mary's church or the many hostelries and other interesting buildings that make up the village on the hill. It is natural to set one's eye on a destination and walk straight towards it. The proposed diversions are inconvenient and considerably longer.'
