#### Dear Residents:

•Burglaries: At the time of writing this article, the 13/06/18, the frequency of the burglaries seemed to have died down a little, with a resurgence just this weekend gone – at least three white masked youths/males early 20s were involved in burglaries on BENGEWORTH ROAD, SUDBURY COURT ROAD and PASTURE ROAD.

We urge you to be vigilant and report any suspicious sightings. If you see someone in the act of breaking into a house then ring 999, we may not be able to send a police vehicle straight away due to call volume but remember a CRIME IN THE HAPPENING is 999.

• **Moped crime**: not a day goes by in BRENT and there isn't some sort of moped enabled crime. Last week there was a group going around in QUEENS PARK with weapons trying to rob members of the public.

A couple of my colleagues were off duty recently when they witnessed two people getting robbed in a matter of 20seconds the officers were in their car, stationary in traffic, on a road in north LONDON waiting for the lights to turn green, four cars ahead of them at the stop light at the traffic lights was an open top super car, then all of a sudden two mopeds sped up, a pillion rider from each bike got off and raced over to the super car, stabbed the occupants in the hand and took their Rolex watches. officers didn't even had a chance to react it happened so fast. Obviously, they helped the victims after it happened, but before they could get out of their cars, the pillions were back on the mopeds (with no number plates) and sped off.

If you hear or see a moped or motorbike being driven recklessly, then more often than not it is stolen and probably up to no good, out to rob someone. Be very careful if you hear one coming up close to you, look about and see that they are not trying to eye you up as a potential target.

Also, please be wary about using your mobiles out in public and being completely distracted whilst using it as it is a regular occurrence that someone on a moped or bicycle can quickly race up and snatch your mobile from your hand.

- Moped thefts/ motorcycle thefts: With know-how it is surprisingly easy to steal a moped so please do consider, if you own one, parking it in your garage or locking it to a ground anchor. This will limit the possibility of anyone being able to steal it.
- Theft of Mercedes emblem: there has recently been a spate of theft of Mercedes emblems from cars in The Crescent and Stapenhill road area. This happened after midnight and a white male in his mid-20s was involved.
- Drug Dealing Northwick Park and Northwick Avenue: your team became aware of drug dealing issues to the University of Westminster students in and around the campus. We managed to identify two of the principle offenders and have managed to get orders prohibiting them from entering the Northwick Park ward. Also, one of them was dealt with by police for a drugs offence which enabled us to provide evidence towards his order.

 The Cold Caller issues: elderly residents have been cold called on by "builders" and "gardeners" in Pasture Road and Byron Road recently.

In the Pasture road situation police were called before the elderly occupant parted with much monies. This group were involved in similar incidents in East London whereby they even brought the elderly occupant to the bank to withdraw monies – he was unsure how much money he had given them and what "work" they had actually done. Frequently, these cold callers will target the elderly or elderly residents who might be in the early stages of dementia, in the hope that they can extract as much money from them as possible for doing little / no "work".

Prevention though is better than reacting to cold caller related incidents and so we urge you under no circumstance give any work or engage with anyone who cold calls to your door. We would like for you to gather intelligence and let us know of the company names they use or their cards if you are cold called on but politely decline their services in all instances. No builder worth their salt has to use such tactics to get work.

Also, if you see builders doing a driveway with an A4 advertisement board outside on the street, do not consider that are reputable builders. In Carlton Avenue West a number of residents saw a driveway being done on a property on the Sudbury Court estate and decided to employ this driveway company (they have a registered company and a website, very easy to create by the way) and all four residents were extremely unhappy with the work done and the manner. Personal recommendation regarding a builder is always a good start but be cautious, there are a lot of rogue builders out there!

Bottom line do not, do not engage with cold callers.

• Other scams targetting the elderly at Cashpoints: one of the local residents was recently using the cashpoint at Tesco North Wembley when he was approached on one side by a male who distracted him saying that the cashpoint doesn't work, when the resident looked up towards this male, another person was trying to take his card from the cashpoint. Fortunately, in this instance, the resident was wise to this scam and promptly told these guys to "Get Lost".

If you are using a cashpoint, particularly if you are elderly, please look around you before you commence to use the cashpoint. If anyone is too close ask them to move back. Cover your PIN whilst entering it and do not get distracted by anyone appearing helpful whilst using the machine as it may be that they are deliberately trying to distract you in order to steal your card.

• Litter and fly tipping: There is a persistent problem of litter and fly tipping, particularly in Peel Road and Byron Road. Peel Road has improved recently but we want to keep it clean.

Your team has been involved in the prosecution of a number of litter bugs and fly tippers. Littering and fly tipping are both environmental offences - fly tipping includes the

leaving of unwanted furniture / toys etc on the pavement outside your address, this is an offence of fly tipping and obstruction of the pavement. I have and will prosecute people involved in making the area look dirty!

If you have a waste/unwanted furniture/item that you want to recycle then bring it to the charity shop or leave it within your house boundary (behind your wall or behind your gate with a note please take on it).

Report any fly tipping to the council - go onto their website and there is a handy mobile phone App that you can download to facilitate the reporting of various matters including fly tipping.

The council offer a number of free bulky item waste collections every year - please contact Brent Council street care department for more info on 0208 937 5050.

# Crime Prevention Advice: Burglary:

- Ensure that your perimeter fence/wall, your house doors and windows are fit for purpose. Boundary walls and fencing along with shrubbery is the first line of defence to an intruder and should be good enough to keep a potential burglar out. A lot of houses in the Sudbury Court Estate have a shared driveway with easy access to the rear, if at all possible, please try to get this open access gated off most burglars gain access via the rear of a house.
- Please ensure that garden sheds are locked and that all garden implements are locked away as frequently these are used to break in to houses.
- Consider getting an alarm / alarm box fitted, CCTV cameras or dummy ones.
- Keep your car keys hidden and <u>not</u> on/in the cabinet near your front door.
- Make sure to secure your side gates when you go out and ensure that your garden fence or wall is durable and designed for purpose to keep out intruders!
- Consider installing an alarm system and a safe for your jewellery and valuables.

#### **Vehicle Crime -**

- do not keep valuables in your car; ideally leave your glove box open and do not leave any goods/property in the car.
- do not leave a sat nav holder on display and rub off all marks of sat navs from your windscreen

• Be on the look out for tow away vehicles, these are being used to steal cars from people's driveways - if you see someone load your neighbours vehicle onto a tow truck/a truck with a hoist and your neighbour is not present then you may be witnessing a theft of your neighbour's car so consider ringing the police - try to obtain the registration number of the tow truck.

Please consult the websites listed for more crime prevention tips or, if you do not have access to the internet perhaps speak to us and we might be able to arrange that you obtain a crime prevention pamphlet.

# Council Election May 3rd 2018

Thank you so much

for electing Margaret, Robert and myself as your local councillors for the next 4 years. We are delighted to represent Northwick Park Ward and will continue to campaign for residents. We do want to hear from you - so please do get in touch about local issues. You can write, telephone or come and see us in person at our monthly surgeries which are held at St Cuthbert's Church Community Room on the 1st Saturday of the month (excluding August & January (and when there has been an election in the month).

<u>Sudbury Court Drive Traffic Calming - Consultation</u> - I have mentioned this exciting project previously in the Courier and also on the doorstep - It was supposed to stop the high-speed traffic and prevent accidents by installing traffic tables. It was also supposed to include improvements at the junction with Sudbury Court Road by the installation of 'virtual islands' and 'parking restrictions'. I had hoped to have a scheme implemented this year.

Unfortunately (in my view), Brent Highways Officers have included in the same Traffic Order and Consultation changes to the traffic flow around the shops at the John Lyon Roundabout. These changes entail making the service road 'one way' and also include closing the access at the rear of the shops. Furthermore, the scheme included 'sleeping policemen' near the Sudbury Court Road junction which I doubt anyone will support?

I agree that something needs to be done in this area as drivers (including known local residents) have been driving in the wrong direction on the dual carriageway to enter this service road for various reasons. Obviously, this is a very dangerous act and needs to be curtailed. However, traffic measures here are such a complex issue (when you speak to residents and shopkeepers) that it needs much forethought and consultation before an acceptable scheme can be arrived at. For now, I and others believe that just closing the central reservation at the rear entrance to the shops would suffice.

I have asked the Highways Officers to remove the One Way proposal from the scheme & do more to solve the problems

associated with the junction with Sudbury Court Road by including Virtual Islands and Parking Restrictions.

Please - if you have any comments on these schemes, do write to me asap.

Pedestrian Crossing at the junction of Sudbury Court Drive and Harrow Road - Several residents have asked that this crossing's timing be revised as it is apparently a problem on the school run for those walking their children to St George's School. I have requested that TFL is contacted and asked to revise the timing of the pedestrian lights and that, when they are on Stop to traffic, no traffic can exit either Sudbury Hill or Greenford Road as these traffic flows seem not to see the pedestrian lights.

I will also be requesting we have an extra pedestrian crossing of some sort near the junction with Sudbury Court Road, as part of the traffic calming schemes previously mentioned.

<u>Building Works</u> - Brent Council now employ Neighbourhood Managers to whom your Councillors can report issues such as damage and nuisance caused by building works, etc. To date, several home owners and contractors have been contacted by Brent's Enforcement Team because of damage caused to the pavements and grass verges. Where the damage is considered to be dangerous, the culprits have so far been persuaded to make them safe again. If the damage is not considered to be a danger to the public, then Enforcement Team will make claims against the culprits for the reinstatement at a later date once the works are complete.

Be warned, if you as an owner do not take measures to prevent damage to the highways as a result of your building works, it is most likely that at some point the Council WILL make a claim against you to rectify the damage. It would be a lot simpler and cheaper to prevent the damage in the first place by making sure that your contractor knows that you will be looking to him to pay for any damage caused.

Hopefully, many of the damaged sections of the pavements which have occurred over the last few years can also be drawn into the enforcement umbrella. I think most of us would agree that most of the damage to our pavements have been caused by building works.

Finally, through the same route, several Noise Abatement notices have been issued against contractors for working outside the allowed hours for noisy building works (only allowed Mon - Friday 8am - 6pm and Sat 8am - 1pm & no bank holiday working). Please do report noise nuisance to us or the Council on 020 8937 1234, these nuisances can be dealt with.

<u>Grahams Construction</u> - are the construction company who are currently building the new premises at Byron Court School and as part of their Civic Responsibility they have been requested to fulfil several small projects in the area. So far, (we have agreement in principal), they are going to:

- Reinstall the wooden bollards that used to surround the green at the junction of Holt Road and Dean Court.
- Replace two of the benches on the green between The Green and Carlton Avenue West, these will have plaques in remembrance of a well know local resident who died recently.
- Grass verges on Abbotts Drive between Audrey Gardens and Norval Road will be repaired & wooden posts installed to prevent traffic from driving on or parking on the grass verges.

Please, if you have a small project that we could include, please let us know and we will ask Grahams and the Council Project Team if it can be included in the scheme.

Elms Lane junction with Sudbury Court Road - As most readers of the Courier will be aware there has been a very long running saga regarding water leaks at this junction which has contributed to the destruction of the road surface as a consequence. Finally the water leaks seem to have been abated and we seemed to be in a position to finally repair the road surface, unfortunately a new (or never before noticed) water leak has appeared at the end of St Georges Close and is now being investigated as to its cause.

<u>Grass Verges</u> - We councillors are really sorry that your grass verges have been allowed to deteriorate to such a state due to them being left uncut for so long during their most prolific growing season - this is when farmers cut their grass for silage - as witnessed on Harrow School farm this week.

Be assured that we councillors are aware how bad things have got and the consequences ensuing from the lack of grass cutting around the area - it should be noted that the mowing of playing fields comes under another contract and necessity to mow. We will do all we can to retain as much mowing of our verges as we can even against the backdrop of reduced income to the Council.

We have been delighted to see how many local residents have assisted in keeping the area neat and tidy by mowing their own and neighbours grass verges in this difficult time, we are also aware of groups of residents who live near our various greens who are considering ways of keeping the grass short in these areas. We are very supportive of these actions.

Who and why - I have to declare - I came one day in the first week of June to find a bottle of champagne on my doorstep, which was quite a pleasant surprise, however, I have no idea who left it or why as no note was left. If this gift relates to me being a councillor, I must declare it in my register of interests. Please, could the kind person please declare themselves?

Community Road Watch—You may have noticed a police officer accompanied by yellow jacketed residents at the bottom of Sudbury Court Drive using radar guns to monitor the speed of drivers using this now dangerous section of our local highways. If you would like to join in, perhaps even suggesting other locations, do give us a shout so you can be referred to be volunteers - it's easy and protects you and your neighbours.

# Health on your travels—part IV

I hope you've booked some exciting holidays this year: make sure you've had any vaccinations you need before travel. really important you obtain good travel advice and recommend www.fitfortravel.nhs.uk for online advice and make an appointment with your GP in good time. Some vaccinations will be provided by your GP and others need a visit to a specialist travel clinic. Some pharmacies also provide vaccinations, but the best source of advice is from a specialist travel clinic where you will have a full assessment in respect to your own medical conditions, and receive vaccinations in a safe setting with emergency back up.

Travellers often need vaccinations against Hepatitis A and B. (Hepatitis is an infection affecting the liver). Since September 2017. Hepatitis B vaccine has been included in the childhood immunisation schedule. are pretty well the last country in the civilised world to add hepatitis B to our children's immunisation schedule (mainly because we did not have very high levels of hepatitis B in the UK, so it did not justify its inclusion).

TRAVEL CLINIC

PRIVATE GPs

If you were born outside the UK you may well have been vaccinated in childhood against Hepatitis B, whilst those of you born in the UK will not have not been vaccinated. The vaccine is extremely effective and it is very well tolerated. There are three injections over six months. (though there is an accelerated schedule) and this will provide life long protection for most of us.

Hepatitis A is another virus affecting the liver which is also spread by close contact, and young travellers will be well advised to have a course of two injections of Hepatitis A which provides 25 years of protection. Hepatitis A and B are often given together in one vaccine, and due to shortages of vaccines we will often use the combined vaccine. Hepatitis vaccines are advised for most travel outside the UK, and you can usually obtain them from your GP. Next month, more exotic destinations may need a wider range of injections!



#### Sparrows 2

As the jingle has it –

Listen to the sparrow three

The Hedge, the House and then the Tree.

Have you succeeded in identifying a dunnock (hedge sparrow) yet, about which we were talking last month?

We continue this little series with the house sparrow this month.

Although they are still among the top three or four birds to be seen in the UK every year, they are suffering a disastrous decline in numbers. Some London parks, which once had huge numbers in them, are totally without them now. Look out to your own garden, it is unlikely that you have any to see. When I first started watching birds, twenty five years ago, there were always some sparrows flying about in our garden. Nowadays, I don't see one from one month to another.

One of many reasons for this decline is the

consequence of the widespread use of insecticide. It's nice to have our flowers and cabbages free of caterpillars, but that is what sparrow chicks depend on in the nest. The chicks will die of starvation without plentiful supplies of caterpillars. And

die they do! Sparrow nest-failure is depressingly common in these days.

To think that I once blocked up a sparrow's nest above our back door-step. For a good reason then - I wouldn't do it now.

We need to ensure food is available for them. Fully fledged, they are basically grain eaters together with insects and some food scraps, but they will go for sunflower hearts from a feeder. Regrettably, putting grain out will encourage the feral pigeons too much and there are too many of them already!

Should you have bushes in your garden with house sparrows roosting in them, it could be worth putting up a sparrow nesting box. These are usually three 'terrace' nest boxes built together, which sparrows like, being very gregarious birds. If you are good on ladders, put these boxes up high on a north facing wall.

#### Swifts' return

Unfortunately I couldn't record your sightings of the swifts' return in early May in last month's Birdwatch. But our little competition continued and Theresa was first in with her sighting on May 7<sup>th</sup>. Francis and Grace reported their sightings on the following two days.

So, thank you to our winners of this year's competition. If it's any consolation to those who didn't feature on the podium, I am still

looking as well!



#### **Baltimore Oriole**

The striking photograph of a Baltimore Oriole was recently taken by Gillian in her 'back yard' in Ohio, USA. She grew up on the estate before marrying and moving on, eventually to America. She frequently

photographs some amazing birds in her garden to share with us, and this is her latest contribution.

The Baltimore Oriole is a passage bird, visiting for several days only as they migrate through - then gone again for another year! Gillian says that they cannot resist oranges and her picture says it all. Thank you, Gillian.

On the day Susan opened up the kitchen to provide us all with tea and cakes, so altogether this proved a very successful and well -organised occasion.

We reached the longest day on June 21<sup>st</sup>, a time when the long hours of daylight make all vegetation grow fast and furiously. While digging out some robust but unwelcome weeds I noticed that most of them had already flowered and no doubt deposited their seeds. Why, I thought, is it harder to encourage more refined plants to set their seed and come again next year? It does need a bit of care, but collecting ripe seed from flowering plants that have thrived in one's garden

seems to work well. We saved seed from last year's godetia, clarkia and larkspur, and sown this year in the Spring these plants will give a good show later in the summer. Maybe happy plants make happy seed and happy gardeners! Enjoy the summer.


