On the same subject, we have started to build our WhatsApp group for the Sudbury Court Estate, following the example set by Pebworth residents. If we have at least a couple of people on the group from each street, we can support each other and our Safer Neighbourhood Team.

We are still looking for a volunteer Courier deliverer for Byron Road—if you and a friend could take it on between you, it would only take a maximum of 40 minutes of your time, per month. Volunteer Street Ambassadors (as per last issue of The Courier) are still needed in some of our streets. Your time commitment for this role would be only an hour so every few months. Dear Residents:

Thank you for attending the recent Community event we hosted in St. Cuthbert's Church on Saturday the 7th of July. We realise that the date did clash with a number of sporting events, however, despite this there was a good turn out.

BURGI ARIFS:

Burglary continues to be a problem on the ward, we are averaging about 3 a week including attempts, as you see in the figures below these have been sporadic though. I believe that some of these are down to the recent influx of cold callers in the area.

COLD CALLERS:

We have been inundated, recently, with reports of cold callers and a number of frauds on the elderly. I am astounded with otherwise sensible people giving "work" to cold callers because, by doing so, you are encouraging them to come into the area!

Remember cold callers is the term given to people you don't know who knock at your house asking you for work / or providing a service for a fee – driveway washing, guttering cleaning, laying driveways, roofing work. Why would you give someone you don't know, never met before, don't know their name, where they live or anything about them access to your property? It beggars belief! If they are on your driveway or doing your gutters do you not think that they will get to find out who lives at your address and the general layout of your address? Don't be surprised if you get burgled if you give someone who cold calls on you "work".

One elderly resident was scammed out of £700 for having their driveway power washed. In another situation, I came across elderly residents on Nathans Road who had been cold called on for gardening work and then the males noticed "some loose slates on the roof", this resident was advised by these

con artists that his neighbour had agreed to pay for half of the cost of the roof replacement, he was encouraged to part with £900, Fortunately, I came across these pair as they were trying to con this elderly resident and both were arrested. One was in possession of a phone stolen in a burglary in Staffordshire.

I don't know how many times I have said about cold callers and not to engage with them, no work person worth their salt cold calls looking for work.

ANOTHER FRAUD:

Recently, a resident (victim) was engaged in conversation by a male passerby who claimed to be looking for a good solicitor as he had "won the national lottery", whilst this conversation is ongoing another male (who is in cahoots with the winner passes by) and becomes involved in the conversation between the victim and the winner. The victim thinks both men are unknown to one another and through an elaborate con, the victim is encouraged to buy out the winner of the winning ticket as he cannot claim due to being "illegal". Please do not fall foul of this. In the past three years at least two residents of Northwick Park ward area have been conned out of several thousands of pounds due to this scam. In this con, the victim is shown a "winning ticket" (fake), has a conversation on the telephone with "Camelot" (not really Camelot but people involved in the scam. It is elaborate fraud and con artists are always good actors and convincing.

HEATING UP:

At the time of writing this article, we are experiencing a bit of a heat wave. Hopefully, to some extent it will continue into August, however, with the heat comes a number of issues mainly to do with security and safety. Already, we have had a few burglaries where the burglars have got in doors left open in the

middle of the day and windows left open at night time. Be careful, try to have some lock on your windows and doors so that someone cannot get in even if you are inside and awake. Most alarms can be put on a partial set at night time so that it activates if any of the main doors or windows are opened.

BONFIRES:

We also have had some really foolish people in their 20s setting a fire for a barbeque in the grass grounds at the rear of Pebworth Road. The grass at the time was tinder dry and their fire could have spread if the wind picked up, fortunately it didn't and we didn't have a wild fire.

CCTV:

CCTV is invaluable and a great tool to catch criminals and burglars, however, it is extremely time consuming for police to interrogate CCTV and we simply do not have the time to view more than an hour of footage for any investigation. If you have got your own CCTV installed then please learn to use the system, if you do get one of our appeals letters please look at your CCTV for the relevant timings and let us know if anything is captured. Police are frequently going from call to call, the neighbourhood police teams do not have the capacity or resourcing to follow up on large amounts of CCTV. We appeal to the public and residents to help us help you.

INFORMATION:

You, the public, are our eyes and ears. It is extremely rare for police to catch a burglar as he is committing the burglary or a robbery in happening. 9 times out of 10, if a resident or passerby has seen something suspicious and called police, we have managed to get there quite quickly and apprehend the criminal. If you are walking the dog or out and about, take a look at what is going on around you - are you looking at someone sitting up in a car about to commit a burglary. I would ask you to be observant, be our eves and ears! If you see something suspicious ring 101 or us (the neighbourhood police team on 0208 7212969 but we may not be on duty. by ringing 101 it filters to officers who are always on duty), if you believe that you are witnessing a robbery or a burglary ring 999. 999 should be used in an emergency if you are witnessing an offence happening someone breaking into a car, assaulting someone, breaking into a house, etc, ring 999

It is as a result of your calls that has led us to discover stolen cars, cars on false plates, deal with ASB (drug dealing etc), the fraudster cold callers who are preying on our elderly and vulnerable. Please keep the information coming – we try to act on the information as quickly as possible. Use your WhatsApp groups to keep each other, and us, informed.

Recently, a resident saw two hooded males in the middle of the night looking into cars with a torch in NORVAL RD. If a thief sees a collection of loose change they will have no hesitation on breaking into your car, some thieves are drug addicts and that couple of pounds in change brings them that much closer to their next fix.

Greetings to all and Happy Summer.

First of all, I would like to thank each and every one of you for re-electing myself and Keith Perrin and also electing for the first time, Cllr. Robert Johnson. We are absolutely thrilled to have been returned to serve you all to the best of our abilities.

I would also like to take this opportunity to thank our departing Councillor, Joshua Murray, who has been elected as the new Ward Councillor for Harlesden Ward. He worked tirelessly for the ward in resolving resident Council and non-Council issues and he will be missed, but our loss is Harlesden's gain.

On the 'Verge'



You will be acutely aware of the length of the grass verges and Greens across the Ward and Borough. Veolia, our Grass cutting contractors, are contracted to provide six cuts across the Borough per year, with the expectation of this being front loaded in Spring/Summer, one in the Autumn and none during Winter. However, there have been some areas that have not been cut since October 2017. Keith, Robert and I escalated this to Council and Veolia Leads and cutting commenced in early June and, due to some issues with cutting performance, they resumed from end of June onwards.

The Council took the decision to reduce the number of cuts and, in tandem, create wild flower meadows to increase bio-diversity. It is clear that residents have not been made aware of this reduction. Response from the Veolia Lead on Contracts and Performance; Lee Connelly:

"Last year, Brent Council introduced a number of programs with the view of making the borough cleaner and greener, increasing biodiversity, and reducing carbon emissions.

Certain areas in parks across Brent have been turned into meadows areas, letting the

grass grow in order to create wildlife havens; reducing CO2 emissions, and increasing biodiversity. The programme will also include a reduction in the number of times grass verges in the borough are cut per year, which will similarly reduce the carbon footprint of the service. This new way of managing grassed areas in Brent will allow parks spending to be better prioritised, in light of the significant budget cuts imposed on the council.

The size of each meadow will vary depending on the size of the park, and all parks will retain some areas that will be kept maintained in a traditional way."

We are endeavouring to obtain a definitive schedule of programmed cuts for the ward; more details later.

Pasture Close—Planned Pavement Reconstruction



Residents of Pasture Close will be in the midst of planned pavement reconstruction,

following the Ward Councillor recommendation, that the pavement and road be upgraded. Works commenced 25 June 2018, and will hopefully be concluded by 17 August 2018.

To assist this work; contractors will be removing all the street trees in Pasture close and new trees will be planted in the winter. I understand residents were informed of the process, but signs are up displaying the content of the works.

Solar Together



Solar Together is a collective purchase scheme for solar panels. The Greater London Authority (GLA) has provided funding for marketing the scheme that included a Direct Mail. Five Boroughs were specifically involved, **Brent, Ealing, Kingston-upon-Thames, Merton and Sutton**.

Brent used most of the budget provided on Facebook adverts and the remaining budget on information sessions. The scheme was also advertised in newsletters to residents.



Brent Council chose to participate to provide a cost effective, easy way for Brent residents considering solar panels to have them installed furthering our aim to make Brent a green Borough.

Brent has had by far the most number of applications with 946 of which 178 were accepted that equates to an average of 11.8 panels per household:

| Average no. Of panels | 11.8 |

Installations are due to take place between June and December 2018. The scheme as a whole aims to install 2MW of solar power across the 5 Boroughs. A second phase of the scheme is expected and once approved, we will let you know for those interested in installing solar panels with discounted central funding. I am aware that those who participated in a similar scheme some 5 years ago are now making profit from the additional

energy generated. Conservation Areas are included in the scheme.

Health on your travels—part V

Are you off to somewhere exotic this year? Some areas require additional vaccinations, which your GP may not be able to provide. Yellow fever is a virus transmitted by mosquitoes. The vaccination is a 'live' vaccine and people on certain medications and with certain health conditions will not be able to receive it and it may not be advisable for those over 65. It can have side effects and patients are sometimes unwell. Your specialist travel nurse will decide whether the risk of aettina Yellow Fever is high, and make a decision whether to vaccinate or not. You may need to be vaccinated against Yellow Fever in order to enter certain countries and you will need a certificate to show you have been vaccinated. If you have a medical condition which would make having the vaccination dangerous for you, you will be provided with a yellow fever exemption certificate. Sometimes we recommend that you should not travel (for example pregnant unvaccinated mums and children under one year). Prior to 2016 it was advised that Yellow Fever vaccination had to be repeated every 10 years, but we now

know that one vaccination gives you lifelong protection. There has recently been a significant outbreak of Yellow Fever in Brazil, so please check your requirements for travel.

Mosquitoes are also responsible for Japanese Encephalitis. As the name suggests it is an illness to consider if travelling to South Asia. Happily, the risk is very low for shortterm travellers to urban areas, but vaccination should be considered for individuals who are going to stay in an area where Japanese Encephalitis is endemic such as ricefields and pig farms. It is an unpleasant illness with significant mortality, and survivors risking long-term neurological problems. Your gapyear student off to Vietnam, Cambodia and Thailand who is going to be trekking and staving away for some time should certainly have Japanese Encephalitis protection, but those of you off to a top-notch hotel in Thailand in urban areas need not fear!

These feet are made for walking...

With Summer well and truly here what better time to start taking regular doses of what was described more than 2000 years ago by the ancient Greek physician Hippocrates as 'the best medicine a person can take.'



Sparrows 3

As the jingle has it – *Listen to the sparrows three The Hedge, the House and the Tree.*

We complete this little series by thinking about the Tree Sparrow. Without a doubt the

most attractive of our sparrow species, but regrettably not one that you will see on our estate. You will need to go well out into the country to a site that is fortunate to host them.

Like the house sparrow, the species is in serious decline. So much so, many farmers have joined together and are making serious efforts, along with bird and nature reserves,

to provide daily food for them. Together with the reserves, they are counting numbers and reporting their sightings to the RSPB and BTO. It is a wonderful joint effort to try to secure the future of the species.

The problem for the tree sparrow is similar to other farmland species in that the ground is ploughed and seeded before the winter. So there is no stubble and fallen seed to provide food for the birds during the winter months.

It is touch and go. There was a small local stronghold of tree sparrows at Beddington Farm (just north of Croydon) that has faded away. I saw a photograph last year of the last two birds surviving on the site!

As you will see in this month's picture, it is a smart looking bird with its chestnut-brown crown, very clearly different from the house sparrow. It's quite the aristocrat of the sparrow family! Should business or pleasure take you to Derbyshire, do visit Carsington Water.

It's a very large reservoir, you will find them there!

Mum blackbird

Our friendly lady blackbird, about which I have written several times, has kept my wife and I happily busy providing suet pellets for

her broods during the last two months.

She, the blackbird, has become verv tame comes for supplies several times a day. She. the blackbird, not wife. mν often comes into the kitchen and hangs about hoping to have her pellets there. But usually wife. she. mγ feeds her. the

blackbird, on the step, while I usually feed her, the blackbird, not my wife, a few feet away from the back door!

In the early days, the blackbird was taking the pellets to the nest, but it was fascinating to watch her fly off in different directions to find her chicks once they had left it. On one occasion, she perched on a flowerpot, head to one side, clearly listening for her chicks to establish where they were. A few seconds later, she flew off in a most unusual direction to where they were to be found.

Just occasionally, a youngster has come to the back door with its mother; very shy and nervous. But perhaps it will remember where suet pellets can be had should food be in short supply in the winter.

Today, as I write, the youngsters have moved on and our friendly blackbird doesn't bother us any more!

Saving Water



How you can help to save water

Having just experienced a particularly hot July with little rainfall, it brings to mind what we can do easily do to save water wherever possible; it's good for the environment and can also help you to save energy and money, especially those who are on a meter.

- Keep a jug of water in the fridge to provide cool water rather than running the tap.
- Air your clothes and get another wear out of them, this will save you time and energy on washing too.
- Water the garden in the early morning or evening when it's cooler and there is less chance of the water evaporating.
- Water pistols are a good way for children to have fun and keep cool.

Reduce the flow of toilet and shower heads using water saving devices (available free from www.affinitywater.co.uk/savewater)

- Paddling pools can use up to 1,000 litres of water, so to keep kids entertained and cool in hot weather whilst using less water, try paddling pool play dates – inviting their friends to share the same paddling pool. You can also use the water on plants afterwards!
- Lawns do not need constant watering

 a sprinkler can use as much as
 1,000 litres of clean drinking water in
 a single hour; more than a family of four would use in a whole day.
 - Take a short shower instead of a bath the average shower uses 40 litres less water than a bath.
- Turning off running water, e.g. while brushing your teeth.
- Fix any leaks and dripping taps.
- Wash your car after the heatwave!
