BURGLARIES:

At least two recent burglaries or attempts have used the resident's ladders to try to access the dwelling— so can residents please ensure that all equipment that can be used to force entry (tools), are stored securely and that all ladders are kept locked away either in a garage or locked to a ladder hook. In another burglary, a door was left open and someone walked in from the street and stole the victim's purse, make sure that you do not leave doors open when you are not immediately about.

As Christmas approaches please be on the look out as typically the burglary rate increases and burglaries tend to happen as it gets dark and before people come home from work.

COLD CALLERS:

Cold callers continue to be a problem in the area. If someone you don't know knocks on vour door trying to sell you something, please politely decline any work/ services (driveway cleaning/ tree cutting / rubbish clearing / driveway construction / roofing / building services / security). If, in the process of declining their services, you hear of a company name, or can get a company card or notice a vehicle being used by the cold callers, then please let me know - phone number and email below. I have dealt with a number of cold calling fraudsters over the years and would strongly advise any resident NOT TO EMPLOY any cold caller. If they don't over charge you, do a sub-standard job, defraud you, fly tip the trees or rubbish you ask them to clear, then you will be the exception!. On the day of writing this article, 09/11/18, I was informed of a 'company' going door to door in Norval Road - a male 'director' of this company is known for fraud. On 20/10/18 we stopped a group on HOLT ROAD who were cold calling looking for painting and decorating work, one of the males in his 40s had

convictions for burglary over 5 years ago, another male with him was not long out of prison.

Remember, 'cold calling' is the term given to persons trying to sell you a product or service without you having prior contact with them i.e. someone randomly knocking at your door offering you building services or trying to sell you some other product or service

We appreciate any information on cold calling locally, but categorically discourage and warn against using any cold caller 'builders', 'roofers, 'driveway cleaners'.

If you know of any elderly residents near to your address, please keep an eye on them as they are more likely to be targeted by these cold caller con-merchants!

DODGY PHONE CALLS AND TAX SCAM-

Likewise, residents, particularly elderly residents, need to be very wary of people that they don't know ringing them.

If a caller says that they are from the bank or police, ask them why they are calling, take their full name, ask for an address and land-line contact telephone number. Please be aware— if these callers are trying to worry or scare you, then please be aware that it is most likely a hoax/con.

Immediately, after the suspect phone call look in the telephone directory or on a bank statement for the correct number for the bank, HMRC, or 101 in the case of the police. Call the correct number and check if the phone number and details quoted in the original call is genuine but DO NOT immediately get scared; take at least ten minutes to process what is being said to you on the phone before you decide to do anything.

Please do not give these callers any of your personal details—any genuine caller will not ask you for your personal details, especially details regarding your bank details or date of birth. Please be very careful.

SCRAPPIES IN THE AREA:

Scrap metal collectors love roving around our area, very rarely will they ask permission to go onto your property, and some are opportunist thieves – I have dealt with scrappies stealing bicycles from people's front gardens. One resident had radiators he was cleaning stolen from his front garden most likely by scrappies. I strongly discourage them from being in the area and will seize their vehicles where I can as rarely will they have the correct insurance or permits to operate in the area.

If you have items to recycle please contact Brent Council and don't leave them out to encourage these scrappies in our area.

EMAIL CONTACTS:

From time to time, your team send out email alerts about particular crime types in the area or other information that we feel residents might benefit from. It's also a way of us trying to trace witnesses.

- **3 Attempted Residential Burglaries**: (i) Watford Road (in 260s, evens side, 13/10 2200hrs, males in balaclavas seen trying to gain access to a house in this locality, were chased off on being seen by people nearby. (ii) Blockley Road (in 80s, evens side, 25/10 at 0245hrs suspects trying to break in via back door, alarm activated, suspects made off). (iii) Kenelm Close (in teens, odds side, 26/10 1100hrs 26/10 1700hrs, ladder put up against rear wall, no entry gained)
- **1 Robbery Person**: (i) Rushout Avenue (11/10 0001hrs, male was assaulted by two white males 20-25, his car key stolen along with other personal property and his car stolen.
- **1 Commercial robbery:** (i) Subway Kenton Road (29/10 2155hrs, two white males late teens threatened staff with a knife to get monies from till).
- **3 Theft of Motor vehicle**: (i) Churchill Ave (08/10 2200hrs 09/10 0545hrs, 17 plate Van stolen from driveway, subsequently recovered in the Slough area).
- (ii) Near 103 Kenton Road (10/10 1530hrs 11/10 2145hrs, Honda motorcycle stolen), (iii) Sudbury Ct Dr (in 90s, odds side, 27/10 2100hrs 28/10 0825hrs, 14 Plate Merc Sprinter van stolen)

1 Theft from motor vehicle: (i) Aspen Drive (near 20s, odds, 27/10 1420hrs, catalytic converter stolen from Toyota Prius)

Crime Prevention Advice: Burglary -

- Ensure that your perimeter fence/wall, your house doors and windows are fit for purpose. Boundary walls and fencing along with shrubbery is the first line of defence to an intruder and should be good enough to keep a potential burglar out. A lot of houses in the Sudbury Court Estate have a shared driveway with easy access to the rear, if at all please try to get this open access gated off most burglars gain access via the rear of a house.
- Please ensure that garden sheds are locked and that all garden implements are locked away as frequently these are used to break in to houses.
- Consider getting an alarm / alarm box fitted, CCTV cameras or dummy ones.
- Keep your car keys hidden and not on/in the cabinet near your front door.
- Make sure to secure your side gates when you go out and ensure that your garden fence or wall is durable and designed for purpose - to keep out intruders!
- Consider installing an alarm system and a safe for your jewellery and valuables.

Vehicle Crime -

• do not keep valuables in your car; ideally leave your glove box open and do not leave any goods/property in the car.

• do not leave a sat nav holder on display and rub off all marks of sat navs from your windscreen

• Be on the look out for tow away vehicles, these are being used to steal cars from people's driveways - if you see someone load your neighbours vehicle onto a tow truck/a truck with a hoist and your neighbour is not present then you may be witnessing a theft of your neighbour's car so consider ringing the police - try obtain the registration number of the tow truck.

Robbery -

- Stay alert! try be aware of your surroundings when you are out and about, this is especially important if you listening to an iPod or on a mobile phone.
- Stay clear! if you think you are being followed or that someone looks like they're up to no good, then cross the road or go into a shop/address ring the police if necessary.

Bicycle Thefts -

- Ensure that you secure your bicycle with a substantial lock at all times and leave in a well lit place.
- obtain your frame number and register your bicycle on www.BikeRegister.com this could assist police in recovering your bicycle if stolen

Byron Court School—update

Very briefly—as I'm sure many of you will be fed up of hearing about this!

The expansion project is on the 'home straight' - following a number of delays, it is now thought that all works will be completed by March.

Still to complete: the 3G pitch and soft landscaping and removal of all temporary accommodation. Also, Highways Works in Nathan's Road are due to be carried out December 10th—21st. (We will update more regularly to local residents on the Spencer Road Residents WhatsApp group.)

The new school building has been completed and handed over to the school. Many of the school's neighbours will have witnessed the increased activity around the last two weekends of October. The construction company has apologised for this—but it would have obviously been more appropriate if the residents had been forewarned!

At time of writing, I understand that children will be using the new classrooms from the end of November/beginning of December. This means that approx 450 children will be using the Nathan's Road entrance—although how this will work when the Highways Works are taking place is anybody's guess at the moment. It will be interesting to see what difference this makes at drop-off/pick-up times.

We will update, next month—please keep us informed of traffic management issues—photos are most useful.

Budget Proposals for 2019-21

The Council has started consultation on the next two budget years 2019/20 and 2020/21 – which were presented at the recent Brent Connects meetings. The attached link sets out the full proposals with options.

Following years of sustained cuts in Central Government funding to Brent, residents are being encouraged to share their views on seventy individual draft budget proposals which would save £26million over the next two years if they were all agreed.

The proposals, of which £20m need to be agreed, have been arranged into four categories. The first category, which includes savings of £10.3m, which is more than half the total amount that need to be agreed, are 'recommended' as the council believes they would have a comparatively minor impact on residents. The other three categories are considered progressively more difficult and the consultation is designed to gauge residents' views on all four categories and the

proposals they contain so that the council can chose between them.

Since 2010 the council has saved £164million and by 2020 the money we receive directly from Government will have been slashed by 79%. At the same time, demand for council services is increasing as we have more elderly, more vulnerable, and more young children in the borough. We are committed to delivering the services that matter most to people but the challenges are real and we need to find big savings on top of the ones we have already found. Inevitably, this means making some tough choices and this consultation is about understanding what choices residents want us to make.

As your local Councillors, we are asking everyone who works and lives in Brent to give us your views and ideas on these proposals – either on the online consultation portal or personally at Brent Connects – and help us make an informed decision later for a balanced budget.

On Street Parking Strategy 2019/2020

On 15th October, the On-Street Parking strategy was approved at Cabinet. The report provided details of an analysis of feedback from the public to identify levels of demand for introducing new Controlled Parking Zones (CPZs) and reviewing existing CPZs to see if they were eligible to be included in the 2018/19 Annual Highways Review Programme.

Demand

An analysis of requests received between 6th November 2017 to 14th August 2018 has been summarised below:

6 further petitions for new CPZs or changes to existing CPZs were received

132 requests for parking changes were received via the online application process 72 of these requests are for new CPZs

48 of these requests are for changes to existing CPZs

3 requests are for changes to the Wembley Stadium Protective Parking Scheme.

14 requests are for new yellow line waiting restrictions

In terms of Northwick Park a petition (Over 50 separate signatures) was received requesting a new CPZ in Northwick Avenue, Rushout Avenue and Churchill Avenue, to prioritise parking spaces for residents and

their visitors. This petition contained 92 signatures. There is a CPZ in adjacent streets in the London Borough of Harrow and it had become evident that the area suffers from traffic and parking congestion, mainly caused by commuters and displaced parking.

Highways Officers felt that this petition demonstrated a high level of community support and recommended that this is included in the programme.

For the Northwick Park Area, some of the roads within the proposed CPZ (such as Northwick Avenue and Rushout Avenue) are on the Wembley Park to Harrow Weald Cycling Quietway proposed route, which was agreed by Cabinet at its meeting on 11th December 2017. £20,000 of TfL funding is likely to be available in 2019/20 (May 2019) for implementation of the CPZ as part of this scheme.

As your local Councillors, we are happy to discuss further with residents, should you require further information on the Cycling Quietway and proposed CPZ.

- —Cut the tree into pieces and put in green garden waste bins.
- —Take it to the Reuse and Recycling Centre
- —Arrange for it to be taken as part of our bulky waste service.

Gritting

More than 300 grit bins will be on the street from the end of November. These will be filled with salt, with a further 1000 tonnes kept in stock.

Officers will monitor road conditions and weather forecasts to ensure proper readiness for any cold weather.

Gritting of the roads in Brent is done on a priority basis to ensure the most important roads are clear for residents, emergency vehicles and public transport.

Health Checks

This may not feel like the time of year to focus on your health, but there might be someone you would like to encourage to address health issues-what about a top to toe check up as a very loving Christmas present? At Harrow Health Care Centre we offer an executive screening which covers all aspects of health (as described last month pension planning for your health). We send you a very full questionnaire in advance. On the day, a nurse will measure all the usual things and take a full panel of bloods to assess kidney, liver, diabetes risk, cholesterol and other lipids, haematology, thyroid function, and prostate for men. ECG is taken and vital graph (for lung function); hearing and vision are also evaluated. You then spend 45 mins with the doctor who will conduct a full medical examination and go through the questionnaire with you. A report is provided within 10 working days which we will also send to your GP. We will discuss screening tests as appropriate, and help you decide what tests are suitable for you.

In the UK, heart disease is the commonest cause of death: half of us will die from a heart attack or stroke. Cardiovascular disease has many contributing factors, incl. high blood pressure, smoking, cholesterol, and family history and is more common in people with pre-existing medical conditions such as diabetes. We will calculate your personal risk score to determine likelihood of developing heart disease and to see where interventions would reduce your risk. Taking control of high blood pressure, or reducing cholesterol levels, taking up exercise and managing weight can have a very positive impact on reducing your risk. Screening for aortic aneurysm will also be discussed in older men—a condition whereby the main blood vessel coming away from the heart becomes enlarged and fragile, so more likely to rupture or burst. If enlargement is detected, preventive surgery will avoid the serious medical emergency which occurs when an aneurysm ruptures. Screening is by ultrasound and is currently offered to men over 70 on the NHS, they can organise the screening directly themselves.



Named with words like 'finest' or 'luxury' to imply it's a treat.

Branded

Products like McVitie's biscuits or Kellogg's cereal.

Own Brand

These tend to be presented in a similar way to manufacturers' brands, but with the supermarket's own take on it.

Value

With names like 'basic' or 'savers', the presentation is deliberately stark to imply it's cut back to the bones."

(source: Money Saving Expert)

The suggestion for saving pennies is to try and drop one brand level and see if you notice the difference—research carried out by Money Saving Expert, and the reason for their 'Downshift Challenge' is that in many, many cases, people do not taste the difference. If this is true—why would you pay more?

So, next time you go to the supermarket, why don't you try swapping one of your usual brands for a cheaper version, and see if you notice the difference?

Your local gardening club

This early November evening many local people are enjoying their gardens while Diwali fireworks are popping and crackling all around. Our local trees are competing with the fireworks to put on a show of autumn glory. 2018 is proving to be a splendid autumn with spells of sunshine lighting up the leaves as they tumble from the trees in the wind.

The activities of the SCHS have wound down very happily at the end of the season. The AGM saw the presentation of prizes. The trophies certainly looked very splendid, polished and engraved with the names of this year's winners. Some of these were presented to the Society when it was first founded.

The Titus Barham Cup, is a beautiful silver chalice given to celebrate domestic skills. Titus Barham's father had founded the Express Dairy Company in 1864 at a time when fresh milk was brought by railway from farms to the growing metropolis. His family lived in a beautiful house in Sudbury surrounded by gardens and a park. Titus, born in 1860, worked hard in the cause of Wemblev achieving Borough status. Chosen as Charter Mayor, he sadly died the day before his inauguration in 1937. Titus generously bequeathed his house and grounds to the borough, a wonderful gift that was celebrated last year in Barham Library on the 80th anniversary of his passing. Barham Park is a treasured open space in an increasingly crowded Sudbury Town. For the SCHS, then, the chalice that he gave to the infant society is rather special. It was first awarded in 1933 to H.J.Walden and since then it has been engraved every year except from 1939-45 when Society activities were curtailed for

the duration of war; though gardeners were busier than ever then – growing vegetables - digging for victory. In those early days when the houses in Sudbury Court were newly built, our local horticultural society brought people together to share ideas as they developed their gardens from virgin farmland. Other SCHS trophies are the Comben Cup and the Wakeling Cup, given to the Society

by the leaders of the company that built the estate and we have the Oatley Cup, donated by the family butcher at North Wembley. Older readers may remember Mr Oatley who always provided 'a little over the ration' to all local families throughout the war years.

You will know by now that I am keen about trees

and would like to encourage young people to take an interest in studying them. So, another feature of our end-of-year activities has been the half-term walk to study the trees in Northwick Park. Though designed for young people, and they were not entirely absent, this SCHS autumn walk gave some of the not -so-young a chance to enjoy a leisurely stroll, observing the trees and hedgerows on a sunny morning in late October. We had time to make close encounters with oak and aspen, ash and plane trees and pondered the meaning of the botanical name of the weeping willow Salix Babylonica. Our picture gives the flavour of the occasion.

Members of SCHS join a long tradition. We hope very much that you will join the Society for the 2019 season. I'll remind you again in the spring! In the meantime, enjoy the Christmas season.

 You can use felt, pipe wrap or other insulating material and cover any outside pipe or fitting with a waterproof material.
- · If you have a cold water tank, make sure it is insulated.
- · If you have an outside tap, insulate it too.
- Check that your external and internal stop taps are working so you will be able to turn off your water supply in an emergency.
- · If it's very cold outside leave central heating on a low setting overnight.
- If you are planning on leaving your home or business unattended for a long period, turn off the water supply at your stop tap.
 Consider leaving the heating on a low setting.
- Fix dripping taps even a small trickle can lead to a frozen pipe.
