Dear Residents:

I will repeat some of what I put in last month's Courier as it is relevant - Summer is practically upon us so please be aware, as the weather gets hotter, of leaving your doors and windows open even if you are in the house - in summer we get an increase in burglaries through open doors/windows both in the daytime and at night. Many an occasion on patrol during the summer, I have seen people leaving their front garage doors open when they are not in their front drive you never know who is passing by so please don't give an opportunist thief a chance. If you want to leave a window ajar, please ensure that your window has a restriction device on it so it can only be opened a certain amount and a person cannot climb in. For full crime prevention advice please read the burglary crime prevention advice on the Met police website.

Attempted Robbery Blockley Road:

On Wednesday 30th April, there was a terrible attempted robbery on an elderly resident. The resident was walking to his car when a male from a group of three teenagers asked him for a cigarette, he then was about to get into his car when the males have attempted to jump in the car. He was punched in this terrible attack; the males ran off towards East I ane

Aggravated Burglaries:

In another terrible attack, there was an aggravated burglary at an address on Watford Road (in 160s, odds side) on Saturday 4th May 2019 at about 23.30hrs. The occupiers heard noises at the rear of the house, next the rear window was smashed in and intruders gained access. Once inside, the burglars have attacked and threatened the occupiers in order to burgle the house. According to my records this is the fifth aggravated burglary that has occurred in the Northwick Park Ward area since the start of 2019. There is

an increase of this type of burglary throughout Northwest London. A lot of the burglars involved in these types of crime are forensically aware and have been wearing masks, hats and gloves in order to limit the avenues of investigation for police, and the vehicles that they have been using have been on false number plates.

Despite this there have been some slip-ups by them and some forensic results, however, I would urge residents to beef up their home security particularly in the evenings when it is dark - put your house alarm on a partial set in hours of darkness when you are inside, have motion activated lights both in the front garden and rear, ensure that your outer front door and inner front door, rear doors are locked with sturdy locks and double locked in hours of darkness. All of the victims of these aggravated burglaries in the Northwick Park area have been Asian and the burglars have threatened the victims and demanded that they show them their gold; if you are Asian I would recommend that you remove all visible signs from your house that might indicate your religious/cultural identity.

Of particular note regarding the above, research on the person who came back on a forensic match for a recent aggravated burglary states that he was involved in cold calling and leaflet dropping so please let us know about people leaflet dropping and cold calling – email me with any intel you have of persons, vehicles and leaflets:

Vehicles involved in crime:

A white FIAT ABARTH has been involved in a theft from a van on Pebworth Road on 24/04/2019 at about 10.54hrs when it was on a false number plate, the vehicle and the white male thief returned on the 30/04/2019

to the same area, again on false plates. The same vehicle is believed to be involved in other thefts whilst also on false plates. The car is a hard top with a sun roof on it.

On 08/05/2019 there was a burglary on Sudbury Court Drive: a dark grey Audi A3 was involved, and it looks like tinted rear windows; three white suspects involved in the burglary. The car was seen to be going up and down the road a number of times, then parking opposite the house that they intend to burgle, then the car is seen to park a little up the road whilst one of the suspects got out and checked out the house; two other males came from this car and then burgled the house.

OWL is now live in NORTHWICK PARK:

I am aware that some residents have tried to register with OWL but were unable to do so, there was a glitch when it first went live but I am now assured by the police contact for this scheme that it has indeed gone live and there is already a good take up from Northwick Park residents.

If you're not aware, OWL is an online neighbourhood watch platform - Online Watch Link. The website is www.owl.co.uk

We, in your neighbourhood police team, will be using this platform to send out alerts to residents about crimes happening in our area and other information of benefit to local residents. We will also be sending out the same alerts on the various What's App groups and from time to time on Twitter.

We urge you as local residents to register on OWL in order to receive these alerts, to use this service is completely free of charge and there is no joining fee whatsoever.

Well, what has your team been up to? – here are a few of our recent activities:

16/04/2019: your team attended an address to carry out a routine arrest enquiry, which was a 'wanted on warrant' enquiry for a theft case - meaning that the person didn't attend court for a theft charge. Hmm, this arrest enquiry was far from routine. We went to the address in question, and made enquiries. We asked for the name of the woman who was wanted (let's say the name is Jane Doe) and the woman who answered the door confirmed her name as that of the wanted woman but claimed never to have been involved in any theft case. I asked to see her passport to confirm her identity and at this time she broke down and said that she isn't Jane Doe but is only using that name for work purposes as she is illegal - that work was as a carer for elderly and disabled people. Needless to say, she was arrested for fraud, the care agencies she works for advised and the matter is still being investigated, but she wasn't the wanted on warrant woman!

09/05/2019: officers from your team conducted a Drugs search warrant at an address in Priory Crescent after suspicions arose that the address was a cannabis factory. indeed did find it to be a cannabis factory: there were two men on the premises, 120 plants and a drying room with approximately 6 bin liner full amounts of loose cannabis in the process of being dried - a street value in the tens of thousands of pounds. The men were arrested, interviewed, charged and remanded in custody for court in June. Other enquiries are ongoing in relation to this. Please, residents, can you read up on how to spot a cannabis factory as these are organised crime networks involved in drug and people trafficking, not to mention the risk of having a cannabis factory in the area with the electrics being overloaded.

08/05/2019 your team also assisted in a search warrant for a Department of Works and Pensions housing fraud case.

Your team continues to try to patrol as often as we can in amongst dealing with our investigations.

Catalytic converter thefts:

Honda Jazz cars and Toyota Prius cars are still being targetted for their catalytic converters. Please if you own one do some research online as to how best to park your car and what measures you can take in order to limit the chances of this happening to your car, speak to the manufacturers. The men involved in this are a group of white men in their 20s, with Irish accents, wearing baseball hats. They jack up the car and remove the catalytic converter in a matter of minutes. They are using a variety of cars as their vehicles, these cars are all on false stuck on plates.

The problem of cold callers is a persistent

issue in this area. There are a number of

Cold callers:

retired people who live in the Northwick Park area and they frequently get targeted by scam and con merchants both on the phone and in person. DO NOT GET ANY GOODS OR SERVICE FROM SOMEONE WHO RANDOMLY PHONES YOU OR CALLS AT YOUR DOORSTEP!! I am astounded with otherwise sensible people giving "work" to cold callers because by doing so you are encouraging them to come into the area! Remember cold callers is the term given to people you don't know who knock at your house asking for work / or to provide a service for a fee - driveway washing, gutter cleaning, laying driveways, roofing. Why on earth would you give someone you don't know, never met before, don't know their real name, where they live or anything else about them access to your property! It beggars belief, if they are on your driveway or doing your gutters do you not think that they will get to find out who lives at your address and the general layout of your address, don't be surprised if you get conned or burgled if you give someone who cold calls on you "work". Bottom line do not, do not engage with cold callers.

How to spot a Cannabis factory, the tell tale signs:

- 1. A cannabis factory will nearly always be a rented property.
- 2. A lot of loud noises when the new occupants move in (drilling holes in walls, etc) but you won't see them or they won't introduce themselves
- 3. Windows blacked out at front of house certainly upstairs and at the rear
- 4. No one seen coming or going from the address at regular hours.
- 5. A lot of compost being delivered at the beginning, typically a lot of vans going to the address at night time at the beginning
- 6. Smell of cannabis on occasions if you don't know what that smells like then it is similar to fox pee.
- 7. High powered lights on occasion, sound of fans in the address.

WhatsApp Groups:

There are two watch groups functioning in the ward – Pebwatch and the SCRA Residents Watch group. For people like me that didn't know what 'WhatsApp' was till a year or two ago, it's a mobile phone messaging group. In these groups residents communicate with each other about suspicious sightings: vehicles and people seen acting suspiciously. It is a brilliant facility for residents to look out for one another, alert each other and confirm/eliminate whether someone is in the area for criminal activities.

Councillor's Comments



Into early summer, the flowers are blooming and I hope everyone is enjoying the recent mild weather.

Parking and traffic issues are definitely on residents' minds, judging by the reports that we receive:

Parking Contraventions



That means Officers have to act quickly and get Serco to the scene as quickly as possible.

The most efficient means of reporting unlawful parking to the council is to call our dedicated enforcement hotline:

020 8290 8300, option 5, option 1.

This hotline is in operation every day (except Christmas Day) from 8am to 9:30pm. The senior Civil Enforcement Officer will need the make, colour, registration and exact location of the vehicle. A Civil Enforcement Officer will then be dispatched either on a moped, car or removal lorry.



A number of residents are reporting blatant parking contraventions, excluding the Byron Court School parking issue (which I will come to later), to all three Councillors. We have forwarded or received photographs from residents showing such situations to Council Officers. These incidents can be very infuriating.

To ensure these drivers are held to account, Council Officers/Civil Enforcement Officers must actually be present in order to take

School Streets Initiative

The School Streets initiative is basically closing off streets around a school during the school run—pick up and drop off. The streets are only accessible to pedestrians and cycles at set times in the morning and afternoon. Vehicles are not permitted to enter the street between these times unless they have been granted an exemption.

You can register for an exemption if you're a



resident living in a school street zone, or in some areas, a blue badge holder.

Signs inform drivers of the restrictions before the entrance to the closed street. Nonregistered vehicles entering the street during the times of operation will be identified by camera and issued a fixed Penalty Notice.

The good thing about this is that, once it's set up, it's not reliant on residents doing anything. It denies access of the road to parents, etc, without affecting the movement of residents, their guests and deliveries – a guest/ deliverer just needs to 'prove' they're visiting/ delivering to a resident. No charge to residents

This initiative seems to fit in with what residents around Byron Court School were discussing previously - some sort of barrier to school-run traffic – the bonus here is that it's not something physical that we have to operate or have keys, or similar, for.

Brent has consulted with regards to pilots of the School Street initiative, and these are currently operational around two other primary schools. The two pilot schools are smaller schools in cul-de-sacs and therefore easier to monitor. They will be monitored to 6 months, and then Byron Court School could be next on the list, subject to local consultation. Watch out for the consultation documents within the coming months.

Neighbourhood Community Infrastructure Levy Bidding Round 2019/2020

The Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) is a charge levied on floor space arising from development in order to fund infrastructure that is needed to support development in an area.

Brent CIL was formally introduced from July 2013.



The NCIL Fund provides grants for community projects that support the regeneration of the borough. At least 15 per cent of all the money collected from new, eligible, developments in the borough must be spent on priorities that are agreed in consultation with the local community.

Brent is divided into five 'CIL Neighbour-hoods'; Harlesden, Kilburn, Kingsbury, Wembley, and Willesden. The value of NCIL grant funding available may vary between Neighbourhoods.

If you have a great idea for a project which could improve the Ward in one way or another, then you could apply for funding from the 2019/20 round.

Where Neighbourhood Priorities have been agreed, community organisations, residents, businesses, and other stakeholders are invited to submit proposals for funding that align to these priorities.

A scheme will not be funded unless it meets all 7 essential criteria. All shortlisted projects must demonstrate that they:

- 1. Meet the CIL Regulations (2010) as amended
- 2. Evidence community backing
- 3. Address the demands that development places on an area
- 4. Reflect the priorities of the council & CIL Neighbourhood
- 5. Be one-off projects that do not require additional revenue funding in their delivery or operation (or identify how additional revenue funding may be met)
- 6. Benefit diverse Brent communities
- 7. Offer value for money

NCIL project proposals may be submitted two times a year. The 2019/20 deadlines for submission are:

30 June 2019 (11.59pm)

1 December 2019 (11.59pm)

The NCIL panel score submitted project proposals according to how well they meet the shortlisting criteria. They consider the scores and the funds available to agree a collection of projects to fund. Projects that are not shortlisted will also receive notification and may request feedback. All project applications must be submitted by the application deadline using the grants portal.

Hay fever—Part 1

Spring must be the very best time, unless you are one of the 20% who has hay fever! Seasonal allergic rhinitis is the medical term for those miserable cold-like signs and symptoms such as dripping congested nose, red itchy eyes, sneezing, itchy throat and pressure on the sinuses.

How do you know you have hay fever and not a cold? Hay fever starts shortly after coming in contact with the substance to which you are allergic, most commonly grass or tree pollen. Your nose will itch and have a watery discharge, your eyes will feel dry and sore, there is an uncomfortable scratchy feeling at the back of your throat and explosive sneezing. You don't have a temperature, there is no thick catarrh, but you may have a cough and wheeziness, and feel tired and unwell. A cold lasts a few days but unfortunately hay fever will go on as long as that substance to which you are allergic is around. Seasonal allergic rhinitis is caused by airborne allergens which are wind

pollinated, the birch tree pollen is highly allergenic and grass pollen is the most common trigger...that's why it's called hay fever. Grass pollen allergy causes symptoms from May to July, but tree pollen allergies start in February through till June; weeds and moulds are from June to September. Symptoms become more severe when the pollen count is high.

You can start treating hay fever yourself by looking cool in wraparound sunglasses, putting Vaseline around the nostril to prevent pollen entering the nose (less cool), staying indoors and keeping windows and doors shut. You should shower and change your clothes after you've been outside to wash the pollen off and don't smoke. The medicines used for allergy will help control the symptoms, not cure the condition, do visit your local Sudbury Court pharmacy for excellent advice.



The power tools and gas hob were out at the Mushroom Log workshop in the Windermere Pub garden at the end of April. We all had fun drilling holes in oak logs, then inoculating them with mushroom spawn (Shitake.



Indian Oyster Lion's Mane) and food sealing with grade wax - used to coat Edam cheese! The wax coating prevents pests and dehydration from destroying the spawn. The logs will be buried in the garden a future area Permablitz and will

bear mushrooms in about 4 years' time.

Ahead of our Permablitz planting day on 12th May, we measured biodiversity levels in the garden area; recording the type and number of plant and insect species found. Increasing biodiversity by planting the permaculture garden is one of the key objectives of NPCG. We'll measure again next vear and it'd be interesting to see the results. We used classic hula hoops to select areas for sampling. Afterwards children (and grown-ups!) had fun showing their hula skills!



And then . . . we started planting the permaculture food forest garden! On 12th May a fantastic effort was made by our dedicated team of supporters and volunteers. Thank you to everyone who generously gave up their time and planted some lovely plants, including apple, pear, plum and cherry trees. Batman Returns!

This month brings with it an increase in activity for bats over our estate. Bats will have emerged from their winter hibernation, have formed summer maternity roosts and most of the females will now be pregnant. At this time they need to feed for long periods and catch sufficient insect food to sustain their developing baby. The two most common species observed over our gardens are either Common Pipistrelles or Soprano Pipistrelles. During June they will give birth to a single baby roughly one third the size of the adult female; about 1.5grammes in weight. The adults average 4.5 to 5.0 grammes. From a human standpoint, this would equate to a baby weighing around 28 pounds or nearly 13 Kg. The babies grow rapidly and will be self sufficient within about 9 weeks from birth. They commence flying when only 3 weeks of age. The babies will be fed on their mother's milk and will start to receive insect food once they start flying.

Batman Returns, continued



We can expect to see the juveniles taking their first flying experiences alongside their mothers in July. If you watch carefully the adult will be seen flying with a slightly smaller youngster mirroring her flight, who will be trying to copy its mother. At first they don't have the stamina for long flights but they soon gain muscle strength and become competent flyers. During the next few weeks they learn all the acrobatics, the stalls. dips and turns that the adults use to chase and capture insects in flight. Soon they will become less reliant on their mother and become self sufficient. The adult bats will then start to disperse elsewhere and leave the young adults to their own devices. Watching the juveniles flying in synchronisation with their mothers during this learning stage makes for a wonderful viewing experience.



I hope to arrange a few evenings of bat viewing using ultrasound bat detectors, on Friday or Saturday evenings locally. Unfortunately sunset occurs late during June/July with bats not usually seen until about 20 minutes after sunset. Children will be welcome but it may be a bit late for them to be out; I aim to repeat the evenings during August / September if there is interest. Watch out on the WhatsApp groups for arrangements because most are arranged at short notice to coincide with suitable weather conditions.

"The health secretary is supporting the call by *The Times* for schools to be protected from poisonous exhaust fumes by banning traffic during drop-off and pick-up times.

In an interview with this newspaper, Matt Hancock praised parents who campaign for "school streets", which are closed to through-traffic for about 45 minutes in the morning and afternoon when children are arriving and leaving.

A temporary ban on traffic to reduce pollution around schools is one of five objectives of *The Times* Clean Air for All campaign. Mr Hancock also supported our call for much better pollution monitoring."

The parents at Byron Court School, as far as I'm aware from my meetings with the school, won't be campaigning for this. But residents in the surrounding streets are looking into it—mainly due to the disruption, safety and anti-social behaviour issues that occur daily during school term times. The environmental grounds are an added bonus.
