Dear Residents:

I would urge residents to join the OWL (Online Watch Link, web address www.owl.co.uk, it's free to register) in order to receive our up-to-date crime alerts – they are relevant to your area so please do join and be informed. OWL is now the primary method that we use to send out alerts, we are not sending email alerts directly to residents anymore and will be putting less on the WhatsApp groups to save duplicating work.

Street Robberies:

On 25th June a lone female had walked from South Kenton Tube station and was attacked in an attempted street robbery of her mobile and bag on Audrey Gardens – this happened at 1130hrs in the morning. The woman was fully alert and wasn't listening to her mobile phone or distracted on her mobile in any way. Fortunately, a heroic workman working on a house in Audrey Gardens saw the incident and chased the wouldbe robber all the way to Northwick Park where he detained him and the male was later arrested by police. This attempted robbery is being investigated and evidence gathered with a view to a prosecution.

On 29th June at about 1940hrs a 13yr old boy was cycling up Spencer Road from Norval Road, and as he rounded the corner into Abbotts Drive his back wheel was kicked, he was destabilised and came to a stop, he was then grabbed by a youth on a bicycle, who was joined by two other youths on bicycles – they then proceeded to assault the boy by punching him and showing him a knife – they robbed him of his mobile phone and ear phones, which the boy wasn't wearing at the time of the robbery. This robbery is also being investigated by police.

What is common in both incidents is that the victims were followed, neither victim was aware of this at the time. In terms of advice,

there is not much I can say as neither victim was distracted on their phone, or listening to music on headphones. What I would say is that, at the time of both incidents, there weren't many people around and so I would advise, when walking in quiet areas

- have a look around every so often, be vigilant.
- if you do think you are being followed, try and stay calm and turn into an address and wait for them to pass by. Knock on the door if necessary, and call the police if you feel the person is still around.

Being followed whilst you are on a bicycle is quite rare in terms of robberies, but having mirrors on your bicycle is not necessarily a bad thing, for general safety reasons.

Quite a number of street robberies happen in close proximity to tube stations or transport hubs, as people leave the transport and have earphones on listening to music, or are talking on their phones – it means they are distracted and often oblivious to what/who's around them and therefore easier to target. So please be alert. Also, quite a number of street robberies are committed by youths on mopeds or bicycles, so please be aware of this too.

Crime involving Bicycles:

On 30th June a male similar to the description of the bicycle robbery of the 13yr old boy (above) was seen loitering on a mountain bike outside South Kenton tube station, the brand of bicycle he was on was mentioned in the description of the trio of robbers from 29th. When I tried to stop this male and detain him, he ran off leaving the bicycle behind. So, not being the long-distance runner I was in my 20s, I seized the abandoned bicycle and gave chase on it, as he fled the male discarded a mobile phone – this was not the mobile phone that was stolen in the robbery on the 29th, but what we call a burner-style phone that is quite often linked to drug

dealing. Whether or not this male is connected to the robbery on the 29th is still being investigated. However, in the course of our investigation we were looking into the bicycle (a Grey Carrera Parva) and querying whether it was stolen - as the male abandoned it, and it was also mentioned in the description of the bicycle in the robbery.

When I ran the checks on Carrera bicycles reported stolen, I found numerous local stolen reports for Carrera bicycles but only about three had the frame number on them!

I would ask residents to register their bicycles on either **BikeRegister** or **Immobilise** – aside from bicycles getting stolen and, on occasion, recovered by police, a lot of stolen bicycles get used in crime and it helps us to deal with the criminals who are in possession of stolen property. Without a frame number it becomes very hard for us to restore a suspected stolen bicycle to its' rightful owner, or to get a prosecution for handling stolen goods. We frequently recover bicycles that have been abandoned in general or during chases – the vast majority of these are without a doubt stolen. Please register your bicycles!

Burglaries:

There continues to be aggravated burglaries occurring across Northwest London involving white masked men breaking into people's houses through the front door, threatening the occupiers with weapons for the family jewellery — the households targeted are mainly Asian, and the offences have occurred in the evening after 1900hrs, and generally in hours of darkness.

It must be pointed out that aggravated burglaries are quite rare, however, it is good practice to double lock your front doors in the evening even if you are in the house and set the alarm on a partial set. If you hear your front door being smashed in, get to an upstairs bedroom lock it/go out into the back garden and ring 999 immediately, say your address and that there are burglars in your house.

Keep an eye out on any persons sitting up in vehicles in the locality, particularly if you don't recognise them from the area — or a group of men 'waiting' for no apparent reason but paying attention to people's comings and goings. If you see anyone acting suspiciously, then consider ringing the police.

Catalytic converter thefts:

Toyota Prius and Honda Jazz cars continue to be targeted for their catalytic converters (CatCon). I was a victim of this crime myself when my CatCon was stolen from my Honda Jazz in a busy residential road just over a month ago now.

A resident of Carlton Avenue West has had a CatCon stolen off his Prius twice and I understand, recently, he found an 'x' on the bonnet wing indicating that someone might have put this on his car to say that the CatCon had been taken from the car, or perhaps marking in some way.

The car parks of Northwick Park hospital and ASDA have also been routinely targeted.

Please, if you own a Prius or Jazz, do some research online as to whether your car is the age of car that is being targeted and how best to reduce the risk to your car - what measures you can take, where and how to park - speak to the manufacturers.

The men involved in this locally are a group of white men in their 20s, with Irish accents, wearing baseball hats. They jack up the car and remove the catalytic converter in a matter of minutes. They are using a variety of cars as their vehicles: these cars are all on

false stuck-on plates.

I, for one, have decided to get rid of my Jazz as I thought it could be targeted again and am now back to transport of the two wheeled or public variety.

Scrap collectors:

On 7th July, after doing CCTV enquiries on Spencer Road in relation to the robbery on the 29th, I observed a white van driving slowly on Abbotts Drive with the occupants of the van looking left and right in towards the driveways of houses. I stopped the van and whilst conducting checks, found there was an information report from Herts Police on the registration number - the van was involved in a recent theft of £1.000 worth of metal: the insurance on the van was fraudulent - we frequently find that scrap collectors have phony insurance - a false name and a remote location, like the Outer Hebrides (for cheap insurance) so they can pass the police ANPR (automatic number plate reader cameras). The driver in this instance had his van seized for no insurance and his image captured, though he wasn't arrested as Herts didn't want this - his full details were obtained and he was advised accordingly.

Dog Issues:

On 4th July a local woman was convicted over a dog-on-dog attack in Northwick Park that occurred on 7th December. The offence she was convicted for was being in charge of an AKITA dog which was dangerously out of control in Northwick Park. Not only was she convicted, but restrictions were put on her AKITA dog, she was also ordered to pay costs and compensation for the vet bills on the injured dog, which was in the region of £1000. The victim's dog was lucky to survive, however, there is no compensation for the ordeal and irreversible behavioural changes to her dog following the vicious attack. Please be careful if you are a dog owner, if your dog has a propensity to bite either humans or other dogs then you must ensure it doesn't get the opportunity to do so.

Over a number of years I have dealt with a number of dog incidents on the ward, these have been for neglect and dangerous dog incidents – some dogs unfortunately as a result of these investigations have been seized and destroyed. Owing to a number of human deaths, nationally, as a result of dog bite incidents, the police are now more strict in applying the dog legislation to non-human bite incidents i.e dog-on-dog attacks, as the dog might pose a future risk to humans. Potentially, your dog could be considered to have committed an offence under the Dangerous Dogs Act if it is involved in an attack on another dog: there are certain aspects to these incidents that would be considered by police in the course of an investigation. So. particularly if you have a big powerful dog, please be responsible - if it is a soppy thing that will always roll over and never jump up on people then perhaps it is ok to walk him off the lead on the pavement or in the park. If your dog, big or small, has snapped or worse still bitten another dog then you need to think about keeping it on the lead or taking evasive measures to direct it away from other dogs. You need to keep an eye on what your dog is doing and that you are in a position to react to it. If you have a dog that runs up to other dogs the whole time, then you can't be texting or oblivious to what it is doing, as certain dogs will not take kindly to other dogs running up to them and jumping on them. Thankfully, dog seizures in Northwick Park are rare enough but a few dog-on-dog incidents have been reported lately in the Northwick Park Wars and so please be aware of your responsibilities as a dog owner.

Brent is among 16 London boroughs that have signed London Play's Play Street Pledge ahead of the event, helping children to play out in the streets where they live and bringing communities together while tackling air pollution. London Car Free Day is on Sunday 22 September 2019 and applications to hold a Play Street must be received by Saturday 20 July, to give the Council time to process their request and arrange for a Temporary Road Closure. The Local Government Boundary Commission for England

The Local Government Boundary Commission for England has published its final recommendations for boundaries for the new electoral arrangements for Brent Council.

The Commission's final recommendations propose that Brent should be represented by 57 borough councillors in the future - six fewer than the current arrangement. The recommendations also propose that those councillors should represent thirteen threecouncillor wards and nine two-councillor wards across the borough. All but one of Brent's current council wards (Kilburn) will change as a result of the review. The changes will be implemented ready for the local elections in 2022. For the Northwick Park Ward, this will mean the loss of the Northwick Park Triangle, which includes Northwick Avenue, Rushout Avenue and Churchill Avenue. The ward Councillors will also reduce from three to two. The number of residents per Councillor will increase from 3102 (for a 3 Councillor Ward representation) to 4665 (for a 2 Councillor Ward representation).

These final recommendations will now be put before Parliament to be made law. The final recommendations are put before Parliament in the form of a draft order. The draft order, if made, gives effect to the final recommendations and is laid before Parliament for a period of 40 sitting days. Parliament can either accept or reject the LGBCE recommendations.

Court Victories for Brent's Private Housing Services

A rogue landlord was ordered to pay a £60,170 fine and £6,000 court costs after being found guilty of making tenants' lives a misery through licensing breaches on 13 June at Willesden Magistrates Court. The fine is the biggest financial penalty Brent Council has secured to date and is a reflection of the truly appalling conditions tenants were living in. In another court case during the same week, a rogue landlord, who rented out an unsafe and unlicensed property in Mapesbury ward, was slammed with a £10,000 fine and costs after ignoring two civil penalty notices issued by the Council.

Have your say on Licencing for Private Rented Properties in Brent


A borough-wide consultation on landlord licensing for privately rented properties in Brent was launched on 10 June 2019, for ten weeks. The online consultation is open to anyone to have their say on landlord licensing in the borough.

Three types of licensing schemes operate in Brent: mandatory, additional and selective licensing. People are being asked whether they are in favour of renewing the selective licensing scheme in Harlesden, Willesden and Wembley Central.

They are also being asked about renewing the additional licensing scheme for houses in multiple occupation (HMOs) with three or more unrelated tenants sharing a home. Thirdly, people are being asked if they support extending the selective licensing scheme to other wards in Brent. Parking meeting—summary

Our parking meeting was held on, what turned out to be, the hottest day of the year so far—but the Church offered cool respite from the heat, and Susan and team supplied much-needed refreshments.

The meeting was a fairly informal one, just for residents to share their main issues around parking, and to see if there was any consensus on possible solutions.

So, for those of you who weren't able to make it, here's a summary of issues high-lighted—which may not come as a surprise to anybody:

- Large business vans parked across the estate, by non-residents, who are using our streets as free parking—sometimes for months at a time.
- commuter parking
- hospital parking
- inconsiderate parking
- residents parking on grass verges and pavements.
- not being allowed to widen driveway/ dropped kerb in the conservation area.

Summary of some the possible solutions put forward:

- CPZ: 1 or 2 hour restrictions at strategic times of day. This took up a good deal of discussion time, and it is a source of strong feelings, especially against. Primarily the cost, it would appear. An informal show of hands showed a majority of those residents

in attendance are against a CPZ. www.brent.go.uk/services-for-residents/parking/parking-permits/parking-charges.

Cllr Perrin has had conversations with the Northwick Park OPE development team to see if they would fund a CPZ - this would need to be carefully negotiated, as it would be for a limited period of time. If anything happened with this, there would have to be a robust get-out clause for residents, but worth pursuing to see what might be on offer.

For clarity—CPZ schemes are residentled—if residents don't want it, it won't happen.

Other solutions talked about:

- strategically placed yellow lines
- painting white lines across driveways
- working with neighbours to adopt tactics for the benefit of residents—e.g. Parking on one side of the street only; neighbours blocking and saving parking spaces for neighbours
- Green Drives—dropped kerbs, for the conservation area.

The Committee discussed at a subsequent meeting, and decided there was no solution to pursue at present. If that changes we will let you know.

What Treatments for Hay Fever? Part 3

Nothing seems to work for me!

We sometimes have enquiries from patients asking for" the hay fever injection". This is a large dose of long acting steroid and in our practice we will not prescribe it because it suppresses your own immune system, and risks you succumbing to serious infections to which your body may not be able to respond. In days gone by, I would provide this treatment exclusively for those taking public exams or getting married but now we feel even those major life events do not justify the risk. though we might provide a short course of oral steroids which is much safer. Desensitisation treatments were very popular many years ago, and patients used to come for weekly injections, but that treatment was withdrawn after there were a number of severe fatal allergic reactions. We now have a safer treatment for those with specific grass pollen allergy, it is a form of immunotherapy. This involves

administration usually with an under-the tongue lozenge of increasing doses of allergen extracts over a period of time in an attempt to trick the immune system so that it no longer reacts to the allergen. Testing to identify exactly what you are allergic to is needed if considering this treatment. However, it also carries some degree of risk, is timeconsuming and expensive and in the UK is generally reserved for patients with specific severe allergies. So most of you with hay fever will have to self-help.... avoid contact with these air born pollens when possible. use your antihistamine medicines regularly and start preventive nasal and eye treatments at least 2 weeks before you expect the symptoms to start if you can. About half of hav fever sufferers will find their symptoms improve and may go away in later life, but an unlucky few may develop hay fever for the first time in middle age!

CITY OF WILDLIFE

A couple of weeks ago, a resident posted on the WhatsApp group about a sighting of a Hedgehog in Northwick Park. When I first moved here, I saw them quite often, but not for at least 5/6 years. Across the UK the population has dwindled by a third since 2000—mostly due to loss of habitat.

One simple way we can help them to thrive around here is to link our gardens, ensuring that they can pass freely through on their nightly travels.

Why do hedgehogs need holes in fences?

Hedgehogs travel around one mile every night, through our parks and gardens in their quest to find enough food and a mate. If you have an enclosed garden you might be getting in the way of their plans.

We can make their life a little easier by removing the barriers within our control—for example, by making holes in or under our garden fences and walls for them to pass through.



13cm by 13cm is sufficient for any hedgehog to pass through—and too small for nearly all pets.

- remove a brick from the bottom of a wall
- cut a small hole in your fence if there are no gaps underneath
- dig a small channel underneath your wall, fence or gate.

You could also provide them with a nesting box for their winter hibernation, or feed them—the website gives lots of information.

Check out the Hedgehog Street campaigns, and become a Hedgehog Champion—there are more than 66,000 registered so far.

If you've read the SNT pages, you will have noted that the incident that I wrote about in the January issue has been concluded with a conviction of the owner of the dog who attacked my dog.

Many of you have asked me about the incident, over the intervening months, and I haven't been able to say much about it, as it's been an ongoing investigation. But your support has been very much appreciated.

Whilst, obviously, I'm delighted that this has now concluded with a bit of justice, it is not really over for us. Tinker's life (and ours) has been irrevocably changed—she's now frightened of most things, even a frog in the

garden! She also howls and cries if she's left on her own, even for 5 minutes—which is why she ended up attending the recent parking meeting(!), and why we now have a network of lovely neighbours who take it in turns to host her when I have to go out to work.

Massive thanks to SNT for being so brilliant—and whilst some of you may think it might be a waste of police time, following up on this type of incident—they saw it as a community safety issue.

Please, if you own a dog, take responsibility for it:

- learn a bit of dog psychology so that you can recognise the first signs of dominance or anxiety in your dog, and carry out some training to avoid further issues developing.
- if it can't be 'calm submissive' around other dogs, or children, please don't have it off lead in public spaces until you've done some training.

And if it does attack another dog, please accept responsibility, go through community resolution if necessary, but don't let it get to Court and take up valuable Police resources.
