

### Northwick Park Safer Neighbourhood Team

Please can residents register on OWL (Online Watch Link, web address www.owl.co.uk). We are sending nearly all of our crime alerts via the OWL system. It is completely free to register so if you want to be in the know then register on OWL!

**Residential burglaries**: At time of writing, the residential burglary figures have decreased and we haven't had any aggravated burglaries recently.

Though the figures are low at the moment in our area, there continues to be aggravated burglaries occurring across NW London involving white masked men breaking into houses through the front door, threatening the occupiers with weapons for the family jewellery. The households targeted are mainly Asian, and the offences have occurred in the evening after 1900hrs, and generally in hours of darkness.

It must be pointed out that aggravated burglaries are quite rare, however, it is good practice to set your house alarm on a partial set in hours of darkness in particular, and also to double lock all doors to the outside.

Install good quality locks on your windows and doors; doors to the exterior should be locked with at least two locks. A London Bar is also advisable, as re-enforcement of the lock stays.

If you hear your front door being smashed in, get to an upstairs bedroom lock it/go out into the back garden and ring 999 immediately, say your address and that there are burglars in your house.

Keep an eye out for any persons sitting up in vehicles in the locality, especially if you don't recognise them from the area – particularly if they are a group of men sitting up in a vehicle for no apparent reason and paying attention to people's comings and goings. If you see anyone acting suspiciously, then consider ringing the police.

I know from reading the various residents'

WhatsApp groups that residents really are being more and more vigilant, and communicating to each other various sightings of suspicious persons and vehicles. This is all good and a brilliant neighbourhood watch tool.

Thefts from cars and vans: recently my sister, who lives in south Brent, was loading her car to go to the airport at 6am. There was no-one about, or so she thought, as she was backwards and forwards from the car. She left her handbag in the unlocked carthe car was only unattended for less than a minute-someone quickly opened the car door and stole her bag containing her mobile and house keys. The inconvenience was huge-locks of the house needed to be changed, no mobile and a lot of contacts lost. Please be aware when you are loading or unloading your car, you never know who is nearby.

Also, please do not leave loose change in your cars – some thieves are drug addicts, on Class A drugs, and would break into a car if they saw a pound visible or loose change in the cigarette tray.

As you can see from the crime figures a number of vans have been broken into for tools, I know it is hard to do but I recommend that no expensive tools are left in works vans, and to park it on your driveway if at all possible.

Catalytic converter thefts: As you can see from the crime figures below, we are still having an issue with the Catalytic Converter thefts - Toyota Prius cars and Honda Jazz cars continue to be the cars of choice by these thieves. The car parks of Northwick Park hospital are being targeted from time to time

Please, if you own a Prius or Jazz, do some research online as to whether your car is the age of car that is being targeted and how

best to park your car; what measures you can take in order to limit the chances of this happening to your car—speak to the manufacturers.

The men involved in this are mainly a group of white men in their 20s, with Irish accents, wearing baseball hats. They jack up the car and remove the Catalytic Converter in a matter of minutes. They are using a variety of cars as their vehicles, these cars are all on false stuck-on plates.

Scrap collectors: please report any vans you see roving around potentially collecting scrap metal. We are finding a lot of people who are doing this activity are also opportunist thieves. A woman who lives in Edgware reported the theft of her cast iron fireplace and the suspects made off in a white van. which I seized last month. She had left the fireplace by her garage, she had a two car length driveway, and a male using this van I seized had walked up and taken the fireplace. Unfortunately, the person driving the van when I stopped it was not the male who took the fireplace. Previously, we have incidents whereby residents have taken their radiators off to bleed them and left them on the front lawn only to come out a short time later and find them taken.

Cold calling telephone scams: can elderly residents please be aware of telephone calls from people they don't know stating that their bank accounts have been compromised. A number of elderly residents have been contacted by a person who claims to be a police detective in Central London and that they have caught someone trying to use their card. Please be aware and cautious of anyone who contacts you out of the blue on the telephone and claims to be from your bank or

the Police and wanting you to confirm bank details, or wants you to go to the bank and withdraw cash because "your bank account has been compromised". Alarm bells should ring immediately, so hang up the telephone and wait for 10 minutes—get your bank statement and ring the telephone number on your statement if you are worried. fraudsters trying to get hold of your money can sound very convincing and professional, they may even have information about you. but don't in any way divulge any personal information or fall for their scare tactics. It is also worthwhile having a telephone call monitoring system, or caller display, and if you don't recognise the number calling you don't answer it.

Cold callers: The problem of cold callers is a persistent issue in this area. There are a number of retired people who live in the Northwick Park area and they frequently get targeted by scam and con merchants both on the phone and in person.

DO NOT GET ANY GOODS OR SERVICES FROM SOMEONE WHO RANDOMLY PHONES YOU OR CALLS AT YOUR DOORSTEP!! Please don't encourage them to come into the area!

Remember 'cold callers' is the term given to someone you don't know and uninvited asking you for work or providing a service for a fee – e.g. driveway washing, gutter cleaning, laying driveways, roofing work, etc. If they are on your driveway/cleaning your gutters they will get to find out who lives at your address and the general layout of your property—don't be surprised if you then get conned or burgled. It happens all too often.

Bottom line—do not, engage with cold callers.

Beggars: On 11th August, on exiting Wembley Central tube station, I was accosted by a male who was begging for money. The male didn't recognise me, but I know that he is a crack addict. A lot of beggars have drink and drug addictions and when / if you give them money you are financing their addictions and encouraging their activities – if you feel you want to help them it is best to give to a charity that is trying to support people with addictions by trying to rehabilitate them.

Similarly, I have dealt with a number of males who are drug addicts hanging around Kenton Road and Northwick Park station begging – do not give to beggars please! You are potentially helping to line a drugdealer's pocket.

Some other beggars around Wembley Central and Northwick Park stations are organised criminal groups who come from Central London and who are entitled to work but choose it as a means of income. Please do not give to beggars as you are encouraging them to continue their activities. And begging is an offence.

#### What has your team been up to?:

Your officers are carrying out a number of investigations, which require preparation for court and paperwork. When we are not doing this we are out on patrol. Here are a few of our notable arrests in the past month:

12/07/2019 PC KENNEDY was on patrol in NORTHWICK PARK when she saw two persons huddled by a tree. She approached the pair and detained them for a drugs search. The male person ran off, and PC KENNEDY then tried to detain the female who put up a violent struggle. Both were later arrested and found guilty of Obstruction at Willesden Magistrates Court. The female was in possession of a crack pipe, and tested positive for cocaine.

Your team did a day of action at the hospital on 29/07/2019. This started off with an early morning trawl of the hospital grounds looking for rough sleepers – the hospital has a problem with, mainly, substance misusers loitering and rough sleeping in A & E and on the hospital grounds.

Following this patrol, the No Right Turn from the Watford Road into the grounds was

monitored and a number of motorists were processed for driving offences in relation to contravening the No Right Turn. Some of these motorists were hospital staff and the hospital were informed. We have had complaints from local residents and the hospital administration themselves about this manoeuvre occurring causing danger to road users.

Later in the morning, a male who lives on the hospital grounds was spotted returning from the park and acting suspiciously on seeing us. He was searched and found to have Class B drugs on him, he was processed for this. He said he had been dealt the cannabis in Northwick Park. We have had complaints from residents in his block about the smell of cannabis, and now we know where / who it is coming from — the managing agents have been informed.

Two suspected Class A drug addicts were spotted on bicycles cycling fast on the one way system in the grounds, attempts were made to stop both of them but we only managed to stop one — on being stopped he managed to ingest something into his mouth. Whilst under arrest, he was conveyed to A & E in relation to what he had ingested, and he later regurgitated 12 wraps of crack and heroin—that evening he was charged at Wembley Police Station for drugs offences. He is believed to be rough sleeping in the hospital grounds and that the wraps were for other drug users hanging around the hospital.

03/08/2019 officers were working with Preston SNT when attention was drawn to a car in Chamberlayne Avenue, off Preston Road. The car had four young males in it. On being detained for a search, two of the four ran off and one was later found-in total three arrested. It transpires that the three arrested are believed to be involved in a gang in Hackney and were on the estate with two knives (one a large hunting knife and lock knife), a balaclava, and gloves. The car was seized, interviews conducted - it was a late shift, off at 3am, when due to finish at 11pm. The group were later released under investigation and the evidence against them is being collated with a view to charges for weapons offences being sought.

#### Refuse Collection etc.

Many of you have experienced missed bin collections over the last month or so, some of you have written to the Lead Member, Councillor Krupa Sheth:

Missed bin collections: an update from Cllr Krupa Sheth, Lead Member for Environment 25 July 2019

We are aware that a number of bin collections have been missed in recent weeks. I can completely understand residents' frustration. It is unacceptable that bins haven't been collected, especially in this heat.

We have been in urgent talks with our contractor, Veolia, to understand what went wrong with their operation and to make sure that they put this right as soon as possible. They are in the process of going back over the roads that have been missed and are working quickly to make sure all missed bins are collected. Our team are doing everything they can to assist them.

Please continue to leave any bins visible and in front of your property so that the Veolia team are able to collect them.

#### UPDATE: 29/07/2019

Following the recent disruption to local recycling and waste collections, Veolia have now resolved their operational issues. We apologise for the inconvenience and will continue to closely monitor collections to make sure residents are receiving the highest possible service.

I have received several notifications from residents during August reporting continued non-collections, rubbish trailing behind the collection vehicles etc. There have also been reports of green waste being secreted into grey bins. If you wish to complain about these issues you may like to write to the Lead Member about your concerns.

#### Spreading The Load for GPs

We all know how difficult it is to get an appointment with our GPs and we often think twice about taking up precious time when our doctors are so overwhelmed. The Royal College of GPs have recently announced that some of the workload of GPs is to be taken up by pharmacists and physiotherapists. Lots of GP consultations are for joint disorders, including back pain and sports injuries and unless musculoskeletal disorders are the special interest of your doctor, GPs are limited to prescribing pain killers and antiinflammatories. The key to resolving most problems lies with the physios who can provide immediate relief with massage and manipulation, and most importantly recommend graded exercise programmes specifically for vou. Having had hip disease for many months culminating in a total hip replacement I know how I have relied on the expert attention of physiotherapists.

We also have so many more people taking medicines, it is unusual to meet anyone over

65 not taking at least one prescribed medicine, and many are taking more than six medications per day. An essential part of every GP consultation is to confirm what drugs the patient is taking, often there is a discrepancy in what is documented and what the patient is actually taking. Prescribing has also become more complicated with drug interactions and restrictions for use. It would be fantastic to have a pharmacist on site to confirm current medication status and advise. Pharmacists are also terrific at identifying when a patient needs to see a doctor, advising and providing treatment when they do not. We are so fortunate in this estate to have a great local resource in the Sudbury Court Pharmacy with the wonderful Khanna family and staff who seem to have been there for decades. Perhaps next time you have a concern, a trip to the pharmacy might have more benefit than a call to 111.

Nail Care Ensure your child's nails are regularly cut following the shape of the end of the toe. This will avoid ingrown toenails a common condition we see when school starts. Well fitting shoes will also avoid nail problems by reducing trauma associated with tight shoes.

**Verruca** A common back to school infection acquired in changing rooms or swimming pools. Home treatments can help and are a good first aid measure. Although use with caution and follow instructions as they have acid and can cause burns if used inappropriately.

Athletes Foot A common infection caused by fungus especially in young, active boys. Good foot hygiene, drying well between toes, using cotton socks which are changed frequently and foot deodorizers and antiperspirants can help. If this does not settle it or any of the issues above come in and see us.

#### Improving the Built Environment for Schoolchildren in Brent

Brent is an exciting place to live, work and play. However, the Borough is also disproportionably impacted by several of London's key issues affecting its youngest citizens.

Brent has the highest number of overweight children than any London Borough and only one in five children meets minimum activity requirements. Children's barriers to outdoor activity thus need to be addressed, and the strengths of the neighbourhood that encourage walking, cycling, sports participation and play should be bolstered.

Over the past year, I embarked upon the challenge to identify these barriers and strengths. In so doing, I considered it to be vital to let Brent children have their say. Hence, I joined a diverse group of 35 primary schoolchildren from all parts of the Borough on their commute to school or on a tour around their home neighbourhood (Byron Court Primary included). During nearly 20 hours of interviews and 60 miles of roads travelled across Brent, key barriers to activity were identified. These ranged from infrastructural issues, such as poor pavement and green space maintenance, through societal issues like criminal activity, to urban planning issues, manifested in the centralisation of services in the Borough. The children also stressed several unique, positive elements of the Brent built environment: the available recreation facilities, cul-de-sacs, and a strong sense of social cohesion stimulated their activity. Along the way, we then developed concrete interventions that could improve the neighbourhood. These included a mobile reporting system for antisocial behaviour, and ways to calm traffic around schools, for instance.

Figure 1: Dominant mode of transport on the way to school for interviewed children,





Figure 2: Activity levels of interviewed children

We hope you had a fabulous summer!


Since the heatwave in mid-July, we've had light rain showers a couple of times a week followed by warm sunny days. Perfect conditions for the plants in the garden to flourish and grow. This and the fantastic support given by everyone on our WhatsApp watering group has greatly helped to keep plants and trees happy.

The chard is certainly thriving—the leaves are huge and waiting to be picked! Teresa H. has done just that. The photos show that chard can be the basis for a delicious vegetable side dish. The secret. apparently, is to first gently cook the stalks (as they take longer to soften) in olive oil and then frv them off in garlic, adding a breeze of salt and pepper. Although the leaves are huge, you may need a mountain of leaves to cre-

ate a substantial side dish as they wilt down whilst cooking, similar to spinach.

Herbs and mint are also ready to be picked – who would have thought we'd already have something to harvest in the first summer! A key benefit of picking or cutting the produce is that "plants will keep growing and won't go to seed so quickly". (Quoting Teresa H.)

Feel free to go ahead and pick some to use in your home kitchen! Maybe try some pineapple mint in a refreshing drink; thyme in stews, or maybe sage in an Italian-inspired saltimbocca. We would love to see photos of the end results, so please come forward if you've picked something from the garden,

Children's activity levels underline the need to act upon these observations and recommendations. As the figures show (Figures 1&2, pg 18), the largest share of interviewed children commuted by car, even though many resided within a fifteen-minute walk from school. Moreover, only a third met the required physical activity target of one hour of daily physical activity on average, with just over one in twenty doing so every day.

These findings have already been extensively discussed with Brent Borough Council, which has been very supportive of this research. The Council not only explores the implementation of the context-specific policy suggestions from this research, but also contributed to an inspiring school trip to Cambridge for participating children. Hence, as Brent offers great possibilities for concrete measures that can improve the health of its youngest residents, I hope this research and broad engagement I experienced will contribute to improving the neighbourhood for children growing up in Brent.

#### Your local gardening club

September! ..... so the holidays are over! Maybe you have come home to a good crop of beans and tomatoes if you were lucky

enough to have a friendly neighbour to keep everything watered while you were away relaxing, perhaps on a sunny shore. Now though, in September, it's harvest time, the season for the SCHS's last show of the year.

The Autumn Show will take place on **Sat 21**<sup>st</sup> **September**, so by the time you're reading this you will have almost three weeks to prepare your exhibits! Roses are still featured, while chrysanthemums and dahlias of various kinds are the speciality flowers this time. Fruit and vegetables will make an

attractive appearance; while in the domestic classes bakers and preserve-makers are challenged to present a mini-hamper or make the notoriously difficult lemon curd! I would especially like to see more young people have a go at designing a miniature garden in a waterproof tray. See page 5 of your 2019 Programme Booklet. It's not too late to phone Robert Smith 020 8904 8017 if, perhaps because you are a new resident, you don't have a copy of it. Everybody, of course, is welcome at St Cuthbert's Church Hall from **3.30pm to 5pm** to view the show and enjoy tea and chat with neighbours and friends.

September is harvest time in so many ways, flower seeds can be gathered, dried and kept in paper envelopes, carefully labelled then stored in a tin in a cool place, to make more plants for next year. It's time too, for a garden check up, to record what has done well this

year and where changes are desirable to keep the garden fresh from season to season. Early autumn is a good time to review

the successes and failures of the past gardening year. I intend to banish an aggressive honeysuckle with woody stems that strangle the climbing roses and provide scant flowers, high up, out of sight and out of reach. There are nicer varieties of honeysuckle that will cover an arbour more gently with fragrant flowers, more easily enjoyed.

mined to have adapanthus in our own garden, a plant was purchased at Waterperry Gardens where, diverting from the A40, we made a pit stop on the way home. Lovingly nurtured in a pot, our agapanthus took its time and refused to bloom again until years later, it had become pot-bound. This year, as the picture shows, it has surpassed itself! Beside it in the picture, the small pot contains three varieties, said to be winter-hardy, purchased at an RHS show in London. Planted all together in one small pot I thought their roots would soon fill it and the flowers would make a triple display. Not so! Three years have passed – lots of leaves, but no flowers. Maybe next year!

Who knows? From the larger pot there may still be a few agapanthus flowers to bring to the Flower Show on the 21<sup>st</sup>. Why not come and join in!


