Northwick Park Safer Neighbourhood Team

Dear Residents:

We in the Neighbourhood Team would like to wish all the residents a Happy Christmas and all the best for 2020!

We would still like more residents to register on OWL – 414 residents are currently registered on Northwick Park ward area, though this figure is the highest uptake in Brent, it is still not many in relation to the number of households in Northwick Park ward – Carlton Avenue West has over 180 houses, so 414 is very little. Please register with OWL if you haven't already done so.

OWL (Online Watch Link, web address www.owl.co.uk) is a free online system that we send out our crime alerts on. In fact, we are sending nearly all of our crime alerts via the OWL system now. It is completely free to register so if you want to be in the know then register on OWL!

• Residential burglaries: At the time of writing this article, the residential burglary figures have decreased and we haven't had an aggravated burglary recently.

Though the figures are low at the moment in this area there continues to be aggravated burglaries occurring across Northwest London involving white masked men breaking into people's houses through the front door, threatening the occupiers with weapons for the family jewellery – the households targeted are mainly Asian, and the offences have occurred in the evening after 1700hrs, and generally in hours of darkness.

It must be pointed out that aggravated burglaries are quite rare, however, it is good practice to set your house alarm on a partial set in hours of darkness in particular and also to double lock all doors to the outside. Install good quality locks on your windows and doors; doors to the exterior should be locked with at least two locks. A London bar is also advisable as re-enforcement of the lock stays.

If you hear your front door being smashed in, get to an upstairs bedroom lock it/go out into the back garden and ring 999 immediately, say your address and that there are burglars in your house.

Keep an eye out on any persons sitting up in vehicles in the locality, especially if you don't recognise them from the area – particularly if they are a group of men sitting up in vehicle for no apparent reason and paying attention to people's comings and goings. If you see anyone acting suspiciously, then consider ringing the police.

I know from reading the various residents WhatsApp groups that residents really are being more and more vigilant and communicating to each other various sightings of suspicious persons and vehicles. This is all good and a brilliant neighbourhood watch tool.

• WhatsApp Group Success chasing off suspected burglars: Before I tell this story (a remarkable true story) I would urge residents to be cautious and not to tackle any suspicious characters themselves, in this incident the residents didn't directly challenge them but did in a roundabout way:

My understanding is that on the 27/10 in the evening time 9pm-ish onwards, residents on the Pebworth Estate (roads off Pebworth Road) noticed a suspicious white van with a roof rack with beginning of registration number DV66 (full reg with police), there were three white males in this vehicle and they were driving around the estate aimlessly.

Members of the Pebwatch WhatsApp group (local residents) communicated the sighting of this van to one another. Following this sighting five residents went out each in their cars to see if the van re-entered the estate and it returned at about 2355hrs via Sudbury Court Drive. These residents followed the van at a safe distance and it drove straight out via Pebworth Road and parked up on Carlton Avenue West outside the church two residents had followed the van at a safe distance in their cars. Three hooded males got out of the van to see if they had been followed. The resident's suspicions were raised further when they saw this. The males in the van must have realised that they were indeed being followed and drove off at speed up Sudbury Court Drive towards Greenford Road, with the residents following and ringing police about the activities of the occupants of this van. The van was not found by police that night.

Now whilst I commend the public spiritedness of the residents, I would urge caution in any situation like this. I understand in this incident the residents in their cars left a safe distance between them and the van at all times. There is no doubt in my mind that these residents did chase off some would-be burglars though.

Following my learning of this incident, I carried out an enquiry into persons connected to this vehicle and got the van flagged to all local response team officers to keep an eye out for, I also put out an OWL message out to warn other residents.

So please keep an eye out for this van it's a white NISSAN ACENTA van with a roof rack

(the rack may possibly be able to removed) the beginning of the reg was DV66 – the image of the actual van was sent out in an OWL message. If it is seen in the area, roving around, ring police immediately 999.

• Cold callers and Distraction burglars: as you can see from the list of crimes below we had an incident of a cold-calling distraction burglary on Elms Lane on the 4th of November, the victim was elderly in her 80s. A summary of what happened is below in the crime figures but, especially if you are elderly, then please be careful if someone you don't know knocks on your door, do not open it — use a spy hole if you have it or only partially open the door if you have a door chain lock, ideally speaking try to find out what they want without opening the door.

The only person who may need to get access to your house is someone to read your electric/gas meter, they should have a meter reading device on them and identification on them. If you are unsure whether they (meter readers) are legitimate then if you know a neighbour you can ring to help check them out then please ring them otherwise consider ringing the police to check them out.

• Cold callers in general: at the time of writing this article, I can see on the WhatsApp group that there are cold callers going around the Pebworth Estate, they have been knocking doors on the estate dressed in orange fluorescent jackets — they were using a silver van, the van has just changed ownership so is not currently registered but is insured to a person in Wolverhampton. Now, I have said it before and I will say it again

and again - please don't trust someone who is knocking on your front door, who you know nothing about, who claim to be x, y and z. I have arrested cold callers previously and I can tell you this - a lot of them have previous convictions for burglary and fraud. Now I am not making this up or trying to alarm you - I just want you not to engage with them, not to enter into any agreement with anyone who calls at your doorstep or puts a leaflet through vour door. If you need any work done on your house then ask one of your neighbours whether they can recommend anyone - that way you limit your chances of being scammed or having someone you know nothing about on your land.

 Cold calling telephone scams: can elderly residents please be aware of telephone calls from people they don't know stating that the bank accounts have been compromised. A number of elderly residents have been contacted on the telephone by a person who claims to be a police detective in central London and that they have caught someone trying to use their card. Please be aware and cautious of anyone who contacts you out of the blue on the telephone and claims to be from your bank or the police and wanting you to confirm bank details or wants you to go to the bank and withdraw cash because "your bank account has been compromised". Alarm bells should ring immediately in your head, so hang up the telephone immediately, wait for 10 minutes, go get your bank statement and then ring the telephone number on your bank statement for your bank if you are worried. These fraudsters trying to get hold of your money can be very convincing and can sound like professional people, they may even have information about you so don't in any way divulge any information or fall for their scare tactics. It is also worthwhile having a telephone call monitoring system, or caller display on your telephone and if you don't recognise the telephone number calling you don't answer it.

Attempted burglary to steal cars/ Thefts of/ from cars and vans: There are a few recent burglary attempts where I suspect that the object of the burglary is to get in to get the car keys and steal a car. In one reported

incident the burglar is seen going around the householder's car in the drive first with something in their hand before trying to get in the front door. I suspect that they had a scanning device and when it didn't pick up a signal from the car key inside the house, they tried to gain entry to the house to get the key but were unsuccessful getting in the front door.

If you are owners of any newish car – certainly cars manufactured within the last 10 years can you please put your keys inside one of those special security pouches when you are at home, as there are some men going around in the early hours of the morning using a device to boost the signal from your key to your car to get into your car and they also have a some technology to start your car. A car thief with a scanner device can steal a car in a matter of a couple of minutes.

From time to time, we receive reports in the morning from some residents that have the Ring door bell or similar systems that they had men in their driveway during the night with laptops or some hand held electronic device. The residents inform us in the morning when they have assessed their Ring activation. If you are awake in the middle of the night and you see someone sneaking onto someone's driveway holding up a device inside a bag, then ring 999 please because they are trying to steal that resident's car. This is such are avoidable crime type, all it involves is you putting your car key inside one of those security pouches - it's called a Faraday pouch and you can buy one relatively cheaply. Please do it.

As I said please do ensure that you lock your car when you leave it because I have also been sent footage of a male recently going around at 3am trying door handles of cars, and in at least one reported instance, a car was unlocked and the resident had left money inside and sunglasses. Please, please do not leave anything of value in your car when it is unattended. A lot of these types of thieves are desperate people, Class A drug addicts, who would think of nothing of smashing your car window if they saw a

pound visible. I would go so far as to say leave your glove compartment open and empty of anything of value. Again by these small measures you are limiting your chances of being a victim of this type of crime.

• Catalytic converter thefts: As you can see from the crime figures below, we are still having the issue with the Catalytic converter thefts – as you can see these thieves now appear to be moving also onto Yaris cars so their target cars are Toyota Yaris, Honda Jazz and Toyota Prius. The car parks of Northwick Park hospital are being targeted from time to time.

Please if you own one of the cars mentioned above do some research online as to whether your car is the age of car that is being targeted and how best to park your car what measures you can take in order to limit the chances of this happening to your car, speak to the manufacturers.

The men involved in this are mainly a group of white men in their 20s, with Irish accents, wearing baseball hats. They jack up the car and remove the catalytic converter in a matter of minutes. They are using a variety of cars as their vehicles, these cars are all on false stuck on plates.

· Abandoned vehicles in the area/stolen vehicles: please can you let us know of any vehicles parked up overnight around the area that you don't think are belonging to your neighbours. The reason for this is that we are aware that a number of stolen vehicles on false plates having been turning up in the Sudbury Court estate - we recently recovered an Audi car that was on false plates stolen in a burglary. We need the make and model of the vehicle, a photo would be good and if you can manage to take a photo of the visible VIN, it's 17 characters long and should be present in the dashboard of the vehicle by the base of the right hand side of the windscreen. Having this number helps us doing our checks. Email me and the SNT re: any cars you have concerns about:

We are finding a lot of people who are doing this activity are also opportunist thieves. Previously, we have incidents whereby residents have taken their radiators off to bleed them and left them on the front lawn only to come out a short time later and find them taken.

What has your team been up to: your team has had various abstractions due to Extinction rebellion and court cases over the past month but we were involved in the arrest of four robbers who had committed a robbery on a bus and also the arrest of two burglars.

WhatsApp groups:

There are now several WhatsApp groups functioning in the ward. For people like me that didn't know what WhatsApp was till a year or two ago it's a mobile phone messaging group. In these groups residents communicate with each other about suspicious sightings and vehicles seen acting suspiciously. It is a brilliant facility for residents to look out for one another, alert each other and confirm/eliminate whether someone is in the area for criminal activities.

Distraction Burglary: Elms Lane (in 50s evens side, 04/11 1755hrs) elderly woman was home alone when there was a knock at the door, two white men outside, one of the males asked whether the occupier could write something for him, victim opened the door, victim was dealing with the male who had asked her to write something down when she noticed that another male had managed to get inside and was coming out of her bedroom, victim later found that jewellery and documentation was stolen.

Robbery person: Elms Lane (31/10 2300hrs, approached by male on mountain bike and his property demanded off victim)

Attempted Robbery person: near 18 Rushout Ave (29/10 2240hrs) 23 year old male was walking along when he was approached by a male who took hold of him, tried to take his watch off him.

Burglary Residential: Peel Road (in 10s evens side, 10/11 1700 – 11/11 0930hrs) shed broken into and two mountain bikes stolen, some days later seen being ridden into Hirst Crescent estate; Littleton Road (in 20s odds, 24/10 0630 – 27/10 0930hrs), unoccupied house broken into via rear kitchen window, jewellery stolen; Foxlees (in 10s evens, 27/10 1800 – 2300hrs) house broken into; Sudbury Court Road (in 70s evens side, discovered on 29/10, occurred overnight) rear window point of entry; Northwick Avenue (in 10s odds side, 5/11 1930 – 05/11 0930), forced entry via rear door house unoccupied.

FOCUSED ON YOUR SAFETY



The railway network in North West London is policed by British Transport Police (BTP) officers based out of Wembley Park Police Station. With around 50 officers and staff, our officers cover the Underground and Mainline railway networks from the Wembley area to Hemel Hempstead in the North and High Wycombe in the West. The BTP is a specialist police force that covers the rail network across England, Wales and Scotland, dealing with all incidents of crime and other matters that involve the railway. We conduct roving and focused patrols in vehicles alongside uniformed and non-uniformed patrols on trains. In London and other major cities we have specialist units available, such as firearms, dog section and specially equipped officers to deal with unattended or other suspicious packages. We retain jurisdiction over railway matters, using our specialist expertise to deal with incidents that affect the ongoing operations of the railway and passengers on it.





Over the past month Wembley officers have been focusing on combating antisocial behaviour, visiting a number of schools to speak with students regarding railway safety. We have also conduct several plain clothes operations on the network combating robbery and other violent offences, with several key arrests of suspects.

Rail travel remains a very safe way to travel, with approximately 20 reported crimes per 1,000,000 passenger journeys. As a force, and a station, we conduct large amounts of work surrounding safeguarding of vulnerable members of society, from lost children to those suffering from mental health crisis. This is often the unseen side of policing and forms a large part of our daily activity.

The rail network in and around London does have a lot of people begging for money - this can be through genuine hardship, but is also utilised by organised criminal gangs using trafficked people to raise money that is used to fund crime. Giving money to beggars can also fuel a cycle of drug and alcohol abuse in that person. Charities such as Shelter and Crisis undertake excellent work with those in need. please think about giving to them instead so they can work with vulnerable people to help them back onto their feet. If you have concerns for someone, especially as winter approaches, you can make a report to Streetlink (www.streetlink.com) who can send an outreach worker to speak with that person and provide support.

Screening

Sudbury Surgery at Vale Farm has a very active Patient Participation Group. We have an email updater list for patients who sign up (on Sudburysurgerypg@aol.com) - and an active Core Group which meets quarterly with the Practice team - and is always looking for new members! Our meetings cover issues of importance patients tell us about, and ways we can help promote health initiatives at the Practice. We were concerned to hear at our last meeting of a big drop in uptake in free health screening - so this notice is to remind patients of availability, and how important this is.

Bowel screening - Men and Women

Bowel cancer screening is offered every 2 years to men and women aged 60 to 74.

People older than this can ask for a screening kit every 2 years by calling the Freephone number 0800 707 60 60.

An additional one-off test called Bowel Scope Screening is being introduced in England for men and women at the age of 55.

Breast Screening – Women only

All women aged 50 up to their 71st birthday are invited for breast screening every 3 years. Invites are sent some time between your 50th and 53rd birthdays.

If you are aged 71 or over, you are still at risk of breast cancer. You can still have breast screening every 3 years. You will need to ask your local breast screening unit for an appointment.

Cervical Screening – Women only

All women and people with a cervix between the ages of 25 and 64 should go for regular cervical screening. You'll get a letter in the post inviting you to make an appointment.

Age When you're invited

under 25 up to 6 months before you turn 25

25 to 49 every 3 years 50 to 64 every 5 years

65 or older only if 1 of your last 3 tests was abnormal

With darkness upon us by the end of the working day and chilly weather to come, we hope that most of the autumn clearing has been completed. Perhaps now is the time to

look out the seasonal lights ready to festoon the front garden, or to think about bringing evergreens some into the house as decoration for the festive season. have some you evergreens in your garden they will now be a major centrefeature. stage, giving structure and form to the winter scene.



The Society's season wound down with a successful AGM on 26th October. The meeting was well attended and plans made for the coming season. Please put these dates into your phone or your new 2020 diary right away. The Plant Sale is planned for 16th May, the Summer Rose Show for 13th June and the Autumn Harvest Show for 19th September.

Next spring the venue for our flower shows at St Cuthbert's Church Hall is due for refurbishment, so will not be available for our usual Spring Show. Instead, this early show will be replaced by a coach trip to visit the RHS garden at Wisley. If you have visited these gardens before you will notice some major changes to the experience. A new visitor centre has recently opened and the gardens will be full of early spring colour at the time of our visit, with inspiring ideas for planting to bring back to your own garden, possibly along with a few

layer of sand at the bottom of the planting hole to settle in. Tulips can still be planted up to the end of the year for flowering in early summer. I once gave tulip bulbs to friends as Christmas gifts and received grateful thanks in May the following year. Why not try this on your gardening friends, or choose a special plant – or even a tree to flower in the spring – to celebrate the festive season. Such gifts often give years of pleasure. Gardening tools also make acceptable presents. about equipping your young people with tools suited to their age? There is something special about all members of the family working together in the garden - and for the young, enjoying gardening leads on to a lifetime of pleasure, to say nothing of learning at an early age how working outdoors can ease the strains and stresses of life. 
