Dear Residents.

Every month I write this article on crime trends/issues that have happened in the neighbourhood – I spend a little time on it, if I can, in the hope that residents will read the article and take heed. Optimistically, I was hoping that it has got a good readership. However, alas, when I hear of residents being victims of scams and I say "Do you read The Courier?" and they answer "No", I feel that a crime (mainly frauds) could have been avoided.

So my request to residents who do read The Courier is to promote the information and advice that can be gained from it, and encourage other local residents to read it too.

Hot Weather - Summer Time Advice:

At the time of writing this article, we have had a spell of hot weather, and obviously I hope that it continues. My advice during hot weather is to always be cautious about leaving windows and doors open — even when you are in the house! Some brazen opportunist thieves can easily enter your house through an open garage or door when you are in the back garden or in the house.

In Summer, we can see an increase of night -time burglaries when the occupiers are asleep in bed and the burglar gains entry through a window that was left open because of the heat. If you are leaving windows open during the night, please ensure that the window has a security device to limit how much it can open i.e that a person cannot open it so far as to get through. Some burglars have climbed up drain pipes and got in open windows on the first floor, so please bear this in mind. I recall some years ago now, a female resident of the Sudbury Court Estate was left so traumatised that she had been burgled at night time while she slept, that she sold her house in the area and moved.

Telephone Scams:

There continues to be elderly/retired residents who are receiving calls from males purporting to be police officers "investigating fraud." In the past month, at least two residents over the age of 70 having been on the receiving end of these con merchants – and that is referring to them kindly!

What to do if you have a telephone call from someone purporting to be a police officer – take their name, shoulder number (not all have shoulder numbers, especially in specialist units), warrant number, the title of the unit they are working in, the station that they are based at, and their telephone extension number. Take a note of what they are saying but **do not** divulge any personal information: bank details, bank card numbers or PINs, **under any circumstance**.

After taking a call like this on your landline, hang up and make sure that you have disconnected the line i.e hung up. Then wait at least 20 minutes before ringing the real police on 101 if you are unsure at all, preferably use your mobile, if you have one. Particularly, if you are in the elderly or retired bracket I would also suggest that you disclose a call of this nature to a friend or family member before taking any action or if you are worried in any way.

In most recent incidents, the scammers are saying that they are "police officers" but in some previous incidents they have claimed to be working for a fraud department in your bank.

Please watch out for other methods that the con artists use to try to get hold of your cash or personal information – please be on high alert if you get a telephone call out of the blue from someone that you don't know. It is most likely a scam especially if it involves

anything to do with your finances!

Watch out for text messages and emails from unknown sources too or claiming to be from your bank, HMRC or Royal Mail. Again don't respond to these texts or click on the links that they are suggesting you do.

Please keep in mind that the VAST majority of unsolicited contact is FAKE / CON and then you can't go wrong, especially if the contact is something to do with monies.

Vehicle Thefts - from and of:

Again within the past month, at 2am a resident rang police as he spotted a male walking on Sudbury Court Drive (evens side) trying door handles of cars. Police attended, caught the male, who wasn't in possession of any stolen items and my understanding is that the original witness did not want to give a statement in relation to what he had seen so we had to let the guy go. This was indeed frustrating.

So please be aware that opportunist thieves go around in the middle of the night trying door handles of cars to check to see if they have been left open and then steal from inside. These thieves are generally drug addicts, who are looking for cash or anything to sell –e.g. glasses, sat nav. So to avoid being a victim of this crime please ensure that you lock your car door – double check it and leave it empty.

My colleague's neighbour discovered the driver's side window of her car was smashed in. She thought that there was nothing of value when she left her car but realised later that her iPhone Charger and car adaptor had been stolen. Lesson – double check it.

A resident recently posted on the WhatsApp group - three white masked men in his driveway in the middle of the night: one male with a laptop size/shape device near the house, waving it about, and another with a tablet-type device trying the door of his Mercedes car. It was not possible to identify the males from the CCTV footage as they were wearing Covid face masks; they were wearing gloves

so no forensics. Fortunately, this resident keeps his key in a Faraday pouch and so the thieves were unsuccessful.

The vast majority of keyless theft of vehicles involves the use of signal boosters (the device that the thieves were in possession of) which basically boosts the signal from your key to the car, thereby enabling the thieves to access your car – putting your key in a Faraday pouch prevents this.

Catalytic converter thefts:

There have been a number of complaints in the WhatsApp group in relation to the Catalytic Converters (CatCon) Thefts and what the police are doing about it.

In order to try to inhibit this type of theft we would need considerably more resources than we have access to. On the night that a BMW was done on Abbotts Drive, myself and a colleague were patrolling the Sudbury Court Estate and other areas of the ward in a marked police vehicle for that purpose, and yet this BMW had it's CatCon stolen whilst we were less than three minutes away.

The thefts happen early mornings, late at night and in the middle of the night and we do not have the number of officers to cover all the ward area all of the time - but we do patrol, and nothing would give us more satisfaction than to get these guys.

In the crime figures below you can see the makes, models and age of car that they are currently targeting -Toyota Prius / Auris, Lexus, Honda Jazz, BMW. The thieves tend not to go onto driveways to try to steal the CatCon so my primary advice is that, if you have a make/model that they are targeting, then please park it on your driveway and not on the street.

Do a bit of research, or talk to a mechanic, to find out what simple measures you can take to try and limit the chances of this happening to your car.

The men involved in this are mainly a group of white men in their 20s, wearing baseball

hats, sometimes wearing high visibility vests. They jack up the car and remove the CatCon in a matter of minutes with hand-held, battery -operated cutting equipment. They are using a variety of cars as their transport, with false stuck-on number plates — most recently a newish looking A Class Mercedes gun metal grey with tinted windows has been involved.

Previously, when an owner has heard the noise of the cutting equipment and gone outside to investigate, they have been threatened with assault by these males. So please be careful, ring the police rather than approach if you see these suspected thieves.

Selling Goods online:

We have had a few residents who have been victims of thefts, when selling mobile phones. They have made arrangements with the online "buyer" (thief) to come to the seller's home address to pay on checking out the mobile. The mobile phone has been reset to factory settings and then as the buyer

is about to give the money he runs off with the phone. In this instance, it is seller beware!

Councillor's Comments

Good day to all.

I hope that this update finds you all in a healthy place and looking forward to getting back into the Community given the release of the restrictions the Government had implemented since March 2020. I hope you are enjoying your new freedoms but, more importantly, that you still remain vigilant and keep yourself, and your family, safe.



Covid-19 Update

Over the period commencing 26 May to the 1 June there were 129 new coronavirus cases identified within the borough, this equates to a 39% increase in comparison to the previous week. Brent's 7-day rate per 100,000 of the population was 34.3 in June 2021and the 7-day positivity rate is 0.8%.

The highest rate of coronavirus cases in Brent are within the younger population and the working-age group. In Brent, we continue to promote the coronavirus public health advice with our residents and where they are able to get coronavirus testing in the borough. We also now have the Vaccine bus,

which is out and about in the borough five days a week, pop-up clinics and GP sites that are available across the borough and also the walk-in service at the mass vaccination site for our residents to be able to receive their coronavirus vaccine.

From April 2021 there have been a total of 2967 vaccine doses given from the pop up site and vaccine bus in Brent.

Grass Cutting Service

As part of a drive to improve our grass verge cutting service, especially during the busy growing period from April to July, Neighbourhood Management had put in place an extra grass cutting team which would have been in place from 26 April to 16 July. This would cut more grass verges, quicker, and with maximum impact during the main growing period.

However, due to the challenging impact of Covid-19 on recruitment (and a smaller pool of specialist recruitment agencies to draw on), we can only provide one additional grass verge cutting team in this busy growing period at present, rather than the normal extra two teams.

The result is that it will take longer to cut grass than normal, and it will be approximately 6 weeks between cuts.

These gaps between cuts are contingent on dry weather and small amounts of rain and no self-isolation from the grass cutting team. Too much rain can stop cutting and lead to longer gaps between cutting.

Please note that since the 2017 reductions in grass verge cutting to 6 cuts a year, grass is allowed to grow to an average, uniform, height of 300mm but this excludes weeds and isolated patches of grass which may be higher than 300mm.

The team(s) must be kept to the schedule on the designated streets. Any decision to move them elsewhere must be a last resort. If they are moved, it will leave them behind on the whole schedule.

Shop Safe, Shop Local: Supporting Local Businesses

As we move out of lockdown, this presents massive opportunities for local businesses to recover.

The Economic Growth team has launched the next phase of a Shop Safe, Shop Local campaign. The Shop Local advert has now been installed on buses and billboards around the borough, as part of the campaign, showcasing some of Brent's fantastic local businesses.

The aim of this campaign is to encourage footfall and spend in local town centres, while also reminding shoppers to follow government safety guidance.

The campaign includes businesses from throughout the borough and focuses on the unique aspects of shopping locally in Brent, including the locations, businesses and products. The feedback so far from local businesses has been extremely positive. In the words of one business owner:

Return to Council face to face meetings.

The Regulations which allowed the Council to hold its formal statutory meetings remotely expired on 6 May 2021. The Council was required to return to face to face physical meetings for all of its statutory committee meetings from 7 May 2021 onwards and indeed have met for the Licensing Committee and Planning Committee.

The physical meetings are done on a socially distanced basis until 21 June, or when the requirements for social distancing are lifted

Given the restrictions in place and limits on the socially distanced meeting venue capacities, press and public attendance will have limited access to public buildings but will continue to have access remotely, with meetings being livestreamed for them to follow.



Common Running Injuries...

Most runners will find themselves sidelined with a foot problem at some point. Anything from a simple blister to a more complex stress fracture can put a halt to training plans. Most running injuries affect the lower body and may include the ankles, legs, knees, hips and groin.

However, feet seem to take a significant hit because they take 3 times body weight when running compared to walking. If you overtrain, ignore pain, or neglect preparation, the repeated stress over time may cause a range of foot problems including blisters, toenail damage or anv of these:

Plantar Fasciitis

A painful condition that causes inflammation of the plantar fascia.

Stress Fractures

A fatigue-induced bone fracture.

Metatarsalgia

A painful irritation of the tissues, muscles, tendons, ligaments, and ioints at the balls of feet.

While the rest of my family was laying under the sun, I decided to go for a quick splash in


the water which was a refreshing break from the 30 degree temperature.

Easy Summer Thirst Quenchers—Jenica J

The sun's out and you're laying on the grass, what better than to have a cold refreshing drink. Here are 2 easy fruit drinks that you can make at home.

Watermelon lemonade

What you need:

- 1 large watermelon
- 250ml lemon juice (you can squeeze fresh lemons)
- 100g of caster sugar
- 1 bottle of sparkling water
- 1 lime
- A small handful of fresh mint
- Ice (crushed)

How to make it:

- 1. Cut a small hole at the top of the watermelon and using a large spoon hollow the melon (make sure to remove any of the seeds)
- 2. Put the watermelon pieces you removed into a blender
- 3. Combine the lemon juice and sugar into the mixture till it forms a purée
- 3. Pour the sparkling water into the water melon mixture
- 4. Fill the hollow watermelon skin with ice and pour in the lemonade mixture

Your watermelon lemonade is now ready!





Easy iced tea

What you need:

- 2 tea bags
- 2 tbsp golden caster sugar
- 1 tbsp runny honey
- 1 lemon to juice and 1 lemon to slice
- 1 orange , sliced
- small bunch mint

How to make it:

- 1. Put the tea bags, sugar, honey and 1.5 litres water in a large jug
- Leave to infuse for as long as possible—cold brewing avoids the bitter taste but does take longer
- 3. Remove the tea bags
- 4. Chill until ready to serve
- 5. Stir in the lemon juice, lemon slices, orange slices and mint leaves
- 6. Fill the jug with ice before serving

For extra sweetness serve with extra honey to taste.

July is high summer for our gardens. demonstrated how to make plant tea fertiliser from nettles, which we collected from the Ducker path. Nettles are a great source οf nutrients and minerals. especially



nitrogen, which are released if nettles are soaked in a bucket of water for about a month. This liquid is a natural fertiliser which can be diluted to water the base of the plant to support its growth. Be warned though, it stinks! 
