Let us hope as Summer approaches that it will see to an end of the restrictions and a resumption to life as it was pre Covid!

The powers that be in charge of Safer Neighbourhood Teams (SNT) have decided to move Dan Kubik to a Harrow SNT, he will be missed, and so now we have another officer who is just come off response team for a SNT rotation and he is also a Dan – PC Dan Gardner. Charlie and myself, SNT stalwarts, are still around.

Summer Time Advice:

Let us also hope that we have some nice weather this summer, and that we can relax in the parks or gardens.

Please be cautious about leaving windows and doors open in hot weather even when you are in the house!. I have seen some brazen thieves in my time, who would walk in an open garage or door when the resident is in the back garden or in the house. Do not give them the opportunity to steal from you. Also, in previous years, pre-covid, we have seen an increase of night time burglaries when the occupiers are asleep in bed and the burglar gets in a window, which was left open because of the heat - if you are leaving windows open during the night please ensure that the window has a security device to limit how much it can open i.e that a person cannot open it so far as to get through, some burglars have climbed up drain pipes and got in open windows on the first floor so please bear this in mind.

Burglary / Scrap metal collectors Alert:

As you can see from the burglary figures below on the 9/04/2021 there was a burglary early in the morning of a house under renovation on Carlton Avenue West. Analysis of the CCTV in relation to this incident, show

two white men late 20s early 30s one well-built/stocky with a beard and the other Mediterranean looking, both wearing high visibility vests trespassing on the property and doing the burglary at 0645hrs in the morning.

When someone is wearing a high visibility vest, a resident might think that they are legitimate contractors so please be aware that burglars or thieves involved in crime might also be wearing these vests in order to give the impression of being legitimate. One of these males was also involved in the theft of a bicycle elsewhere in the north west area on the 22/04 so please be on the look-out. The local officers are on the look-out for this pair of thieves

Please report any vehicles roving around that you think might be up to no good both on 101 and on the resident What's App group – contact me with your name, address and mobile number if you wish to be added to your local residents What's App group.

Any crime that is happening/occurring (present tense) with the suspect still there/nearby is an emergency call and please ring 999.

Cold Callers Permanent Alert:

We covered a lot in last month's Courier—in summary:

Please keep in mind that the VAST majority of unsolicited contact is FAKE / CON and then you can't go wrong, especially if the contact is something to do with monies.

In the past month, even our Safer Neighbourhood Team mobile phone had text messages purporting to be from 'our' bank and instructing to click a link to confirm that we didn't authorise a transaction. The phone number is obviously not linked to any bank

account – in our instance, it came with the message "HSBC FRAUD ALERT" and said to click a link if you did not send £240 to Mr. C Jones. Obviously, this is an attempt to get information from our phone or for us to pass information over.

This shows you that these texts are sent to random numbers—they don't know anything about you or your personal details unless you tell them.

Apparently, if you click the link in these texts, you're directed to a page where you are asked to enter your details: name, address, bank details, etc, and I have just seen it on TV where a victim got one of these texts looking like it came from ROYAL MAIL saying that they needed payment of £1.99 for something and to click the link, she did so and had to enter her personal details, bank details and later got a phone call purporting to be from her bank stating that the monies in her bank account were at risk and asking her to transfer her balance, which she did – she lost £15.000!

My sister also had two similar text messages, however, in her instance the text supposedly showed it came from a bank she is with and despite me regularly telling her of all the various scams, she thought it was genuine and clicked the link.

It was only afterwards that she realised that she shouldn't have done it.

What are other risks if you click these links? Well, as opposed to being directed to a page where you have to enter your details, your phone might become infected with a virus, or it could enable someone to hack into your The information on your mobile mobile. could be at risk. If you have a SMART mobile phone, it is advisable to consider whether the security systems on the mobile are adequate to protect against hacking/ viruses - consider getting software installed to protect against this, but please be aware of these scams and don't just click links this is also true of unsolicited emails, please be very careful about opening emails from unknown sources on your phone or computer.

Parcel Thieves:

From time to time we get reports of parcel deliveries that are stolen from residents' driveways (behind a bin, in an unlocked porch etc). Please—if you're getting a delivery and you're not going to be in, arrange for it to go to a shop or somewhere safe indoors where you can pick it up.

Cannabis factories:

'Cannabis factory' is the term given to a residential or commercial unit that has been made into a greenhouse for the cultivation of cannabis. It is obviously an illegal enterprise and is frequently connected with Organised Crime Networks who are involved in large scale distribution of cannabis and human trafficking, the persons tending the plants (we refer to them as "gardeners") will often be illegal immigrants trafficked in.

Cannabis factories are dangerous set ups as well. The large scale energy consumption required for the strong lighting and ventilation mean that the mains electricity is frequently hacked into and the meter by-passed; it is not unknown for cannabis factories to catch fire due to overloading of the electricity.

You do not want one of these next door to you so here are some tips on how to spot a cannabis factory:

- They are normally a rental property.
- In the case when the new occupants are setting up a cannabis factory you will hear a lot of construction work, banging and hammering etc the electrics is being hacked into, ventilation ducting erected, lighting erected. Lots of deliveries, perhaps you have noticed compost or plant pots being delivered but this will generally happen at night time.
- The window will be constantly covered and the house appear unoccupied are the curtains drawn all the time? In cannabis factories the window are blocked up with sheeting to stop you from seeing what is going on inside, the powerful lights used in the cultivation process.

- Sickly smell of cannabis, constantly coming from an address. A lot of cannabis factories are discovered by passers-by who catch a whiff of cannabis smell and notice other signs indicative of a cannabis factory.
- In some cannabis factories, there is a high level of condensation from the numbers of plants growing inside.
- House in darkness and visitors particularly at night time or in hours of darkness.
- Buzz of ventilation cannabis factories have various ducting, use ventilation systems and sometimes filters to filter out the smell. The buzz of a ventilation system on an apparent unoccupied property is an indication of a cannabis factory. The ventilation system is to regulate the heat, the condensation and the smell.
- Cannabis factories are significantly warmer than neighbouring houses, because the plants need to be kept at a higher temperature to promote the growth. In cold or frosty

weather, the roof of a cannabis factory will not have frost or very little snow on it.

 Occasionally, if the persons involved in a cannabis factory haven't sealed the windows enough you might get a glimpse of bright lights from inside which will be on all day and night.

Keeping Safe out n About (PSNI website):

- Cover up expensive-looking jewellery. Carry your bag close to you with the clasp facing inwards. Carry your house keys in your pocket. If someone grabs your bag, let it go, do not get hurt. Your safety is more important than your property.
- Remember flight not fight!
- Don't take short cuts through dark alleys, parks etc. Walk facing the traffic, so a car cannot pull up behind you unnoticed.
- Don't hitch-hike or take lifts from strangers.



- When walking alone carry a personal attack alarm. Carry it in your hand so you can use it immediately to scare off an attacker. Make sure it is designed to continue sounding if it is dropped or falls to the ground.
- Self-defence/safety awareness classes may help you feel more secure, but remember flight not fight!
- Arrange transport home in advance. Do not go out alone. Don't get isolated from your friends.
- Stay in well-lit areas and don't wander in areas you are unsure of.
- Never leave your drink unattended or accept a drink from someone who you don't know or trust.
- If you feel drunk, dizzy or disorientated seek help from a trusted friend or a member of bar staff.
- Consider carefully whether to leave with someone you have just met.
- When jogging or cycling, vary your route and time. Use well-lit roads with pavements.
 On parkland, keep to main paths and open spaces where you can see and be seen by other people - avoid wooded areas. Listening to music on your phones etc may limit your awareness to the surroundings.

Crime Prevention Advice:

Burglary -

- Ensure that your perimeter fence/wall, your house doors and windows are fit for purpose. Boundary walls and fencing along with shrubbery is the first line of defence to an intruder and should be good enough to keep a potential burglar out. A lot of houses in the Sudbury Court Estate have a shared driveway with easy access to the rear, if at all please try to get this open access gated off most burglars gain access via the rear of a house.
- Please ensure that garden sheds are locked and that all garden implements are locked away as frequently these are used to break in to houses.

- Consider getting an alarm / alarm box fitted, CCTV cameras or dummy ones.
- Keep your car keys hidden and not on/in the cabinet near your front door.
- Make sure to secure your side gates when you go out and ensure that your garden fence or wall is durable and designed for purpose to keep out intruders!
- Consider installing an alarm system and a safe for your jewellery and valuables.

Vehicle Crime -

- do not keep valuables in your car; ideally leave your glove box open and do not leave any goods/property in the car.
- do not leave a sat nav holder on display and rub off all marks of sat navs from your windscreen.
- Be on the look out for tow away vehicles, these are being used to steal cars from people's driveways if you see someone load your neighbours vehicle onto a tow truck/a truck with a hoist and your neighbour is not present then you may be witnessing a theft of your neighbour's car so consider ringing the police try obtain the registration number of the tow truck

Robbery -

- Stay alert! try to be aware of your surroundings when you are out and about, this is especially important if listening to an iPod or on a mobile phone.
- Stay clear! if you think you are being followed or that someone looks like they're up to no good, then cross the road or go into a shop/address ring the police if necessary.

Bicycle Thefts -

- Always secure your bicycle with a substantial lock and leave in a well lit place.
- obtain your frame number and register it on www.BikeRegister.com or www.immobilise.com - this could assist police in recovering your bicycle if stolen.

Good day to all.

I hope that this update finds you in a healthy place and looking forward to getting into travelling mode, now that the Government has published the Red, Amber and Green List for countries to travel to. I certainly am looking to take a break abroad for the first time in ages!!!

The vaccination programme seems to be going well as you will see from the updates below.



Covid-19 Update

Our infection rate is rising, albeit from a low base, and is now 42 per 100,000 with a positivity rate of 1.4%

from the PCR tests done to date. The highest rates are in the 11 to 18 years age group with very low rates in the over 60s.

Return to Council face to face meetings

The Regulations which allow the Council to hold its formal statutory meetings remotely expired on 6 May 2021. Legal proceedings issued by the Association of Democratic Services Officers (ADSO) and Lawyers in Local Government (LLG) (supported by Herts County Council) seeking a declaration from

the High Court on whether remote meetings would be able to continue under existing primary legislation once the regulations expired were heard on 21 April 2021. The High Court judgement was received on 28 April 2021, which resulted in the case being dismissed.

This means that the Council was required to return to face to face physical meetings for all of its statutory committee meetings from 7 May 2021 onwards. Plans were made for the return to physical meetings which will involve members of the committee and officers attending on a socially distanced basis until 21 June, or when the requirements for social distancing are lifted.

Given the current restrictions in place and limits on the socially distanced meeting venue capacities, press and public attendance will continue to be managed remotely, with meetings being live streamed for them to follow

Assembly elections.

Congratulation go to Councillor Krupesh Hirani, who was duly elected as an Assembly Member to represent the Brent and Harrow constituency (taking over from Navin Shah)

We are still getting a number of reports about flytipping, broken pavements, damaged verges and other matters. Whilst we are happy to take these issues on for you, it may be easier and quicker to use the Love Clean Streets App! The Love Clean Streets app (formerly the Cleaner Brent App) makes it easy to report litter, illegal rubbish dumping, dog mess, potholes and other problems in streets, parks and cemeteries (see the list below), to the Council, using your smart phone, for free!

What you can report using this app

- Graffiti, Illegal rubbish dumping Discarded items next to a road, in parks or cemeteries and in rivers
- Fly-posting Adverts illegally posted on public properties
- A street that needs sweeping
- A grit bin that is empty and needs filling
- Dog fouling
- Dead Animals
- Grass that needs cutting in verges or in parks or cemeteries
- Shrubs that need pruning or weeding
- Litter bins that need emptying (in streets, parks or cemeteries)

- Potholes
- Broken or damaged manhole cover
- Faded White Lines
- Broken or damaged pavements and kerbs
- Broken or damaged bollards and guardrails
- Damaged or missing street furniture
- Damaged or missing street signs
- Blocked gully (both flooded and non-flooded)
- Damaged or missing drain cover
- Low hanging branches
- Damaged or dead tree
- Overgrown highway tree
- Overgrown private tree
- Tree stump removal requests

How does it work?

- 1. See a problem
- 2. Open the Love Clean Streets app
- 3. Take a picture, your location is automatically detected and displays the authorities colours if they're in the Love Clean Streets Family
- 4. Enter some basic information and post the report in seconds!

You will receive confirmation that the event has been reported and confirmation when the report is closed.

You may receive an email advising that your report has been closed, but the rubbish is still there. This normally means that the waste you reported is on private land.



This waste will not be cleared automatically by our contractor. Instead, the details will be passed to our waste enforcement team to investigate. It is the responsibility of the land owner to clear waste in these instances.

You will need to make sure your phone GPS or location service settings are enabled for the app to work. Use of the app will be dependent on mobile phone network coverage in each area. Please contact your network provider for further information.

Brent's Digital Landlord Forum

Over 300 people tuned in virtually to take part in Brent's first ever Digital Landlord Forum in April.

The event included presentations from keynote speakers such as Paul Shamplina, host of Channel 5's 'Nightmare Tenants, Slum Landlords'; Peter Littlewood, Founder and Director of iHowZ; Gavin Dick, Senior Policy Officer NRLA; Jamal Khan from Churchill Tax Advisors: and Richard Tacagni, Director of London Property Licensing. The Landlord Forum takes place every year and is an opportunity for the council to reach out and engage with landlords, developers, property investors and sponsors in the property industry. The success of this year's Digital Landlord Forum shows that there is a real appetite within this group to share learnings, examples of best practice and work together

to drive up standards in the private rented sector.

SCRA Update

Following the Executive Committee meeting on 5th May:

E-scooters

We have had several reports of e-scooters being ridden in an unsafe manner on roads and pavements. Currently the use of e-scooters on public land is illegal in Brent. They can only be used in public roads as part of trials, none of which are being conducted in Brent. If you do see e-scooters being used this is a police matter and should be reported as such.

Barham Park Residential Development

The committee became aware of the application to demolish 2 cottages that were originally built for park wardens, and to replace them with a 4-storey development comprising 9 residential units. The SCRA Executive have submitted an objection to this as it is against the restrictive covenants on the site and would have many other serious negative implications for the park and the surrounding area. We also feel that this would set a

precedent for other developments on our valuable parks and green spaces.

come after the stormy weather of early May and the garden smiles, having had a good drink – we can all share in the pleasure of that experience!


By June the Spring flowers will have gone over, replaced perhaps with some annual bedding plants to give summer colour alongside
