Catalytic Converter Thefts—Update:

As you can see from the stats below and the stats in previous months, this is a big problem through the North West London and Harrow area. If you are a regular reader of The Courier then you will know that I have too suffered the theft of my catalytic converter a couple of years ago when this spate of thefts was beginning to take off. I was recently chatting to a mini cab driver, who was driving a Prius, about how prevalent this type of crime is and he told me that he got a plate welded on to protect his catalytic converter for £150 by his mechanic. This money was considerably well spent and I wish I did it for my 2006 Jazz, which I sold following the theft of my catalytic converter. I would advise residents who have old Honda Jazz, Honda CRV, Toyota Prius, Lexus, BMW 316 to consider getting this plate fitted to combat this type of theft – this is especially important if your car is old and of the makes listed as it is likely that your insurance will Write-off your car if it happens to you.

I hear you asking what are the police doing about these criminals? I am not au fait with any proactive enquiries into who is processing these stolen catalytic converters. As regards the criminals themselves and their activities, most officers when they are going about their other duties are on the look-out for these thieves but the reality is that they, the thieves, are very fast at what they do they quickly jack up the car, steal the catalytic converter with a handheld, batteryoperated tool such as a small angle grinder, they threaten witnesses who see them. By the time police get the call the men (generally described as white mid 20s wearing masks) are well on their way, the cars they use are on false plates and they wear gloves. They operate all hours- morning, noon and night. When we get a call of a catalytic converter theft that has just happened, response team officers, if available, will look in the area for the getaway vehicle.

I would like to be able to give you a good success story about an arrest(s) for this type of crime but unfortunately I am unaware of any recent ones. I am aware of some months ago police response team officers were involved in a chase of a vehicle that was suspected of involvement in this type of crime, which resulted in a chase around the back streets of Sudbury in the middle of the night and a crash of the bandit vehicle, the suspects ran away and no arrests were made. When confronted these criminals will behave violently and recklessly as demonstrated in this chase.

Please err on the side of caution when confronting any of these criminals as they have come equipped with baseball bat(s) and obviously are in possession of the angle grinder. In a recent incident, just after 11pm at night, a resident of the Sudbury Court Estate has seen males approach his car, which was on a driveway, he has then seen one of the males jack up the car, and in an effort to prevent them from doing this, he threw something out the window at the males, one of the males has then proceeded to smash several of the windows of his car and then made off in a dark car, believed to be a Mercedes.

I, once again, would advise residents who own any of the target cars to consider getting this plate or guard fitted.

Telephone scam:

You may remember, in the May issue of the Courier, I made you aware of the telephone scam/fraud of a retired resident by a person purporting to be from the police which occurred in late March in the Pebworth Estate. As a result of the investigation by SNT and CID, two persons were arrested for their suspected involvement in this scam. The investigation into this fraud is still ongoing. I would like to thank the various residents and victim who helped with CCTV.

General alert - unsolicited contact by phone, email or in person

If you receive unexpected contact from an unknown person who says they are from the Police, your bank, HMRC, Royal Mail, Amazon, NHS (Covid passport), etc - the general advice is to get as much specific information as possible about their identity and the nature of their business with you. And then verify it independently.

By landline phone: you hang up. Wait at least 20 mins to make sure the line is free. While you're waiting, go to your bank statement/or letterhead and use that number to call to verify the identity and issue. Before dialling, make sure you can hear the dialling tone. Preferably use a different phone. If you're at all concerned, please talk to a friend or family member before you follow up.

By email or text message: do not click on any link in the message. Either ignore the message entirely, as chances are it is a scam, or verify the information in the message by finding the correct phone number or email address, as above.

Do not under any circumstances give any personal information to anyone—they may try and trick you into thinking that they already have your details and they want you to confirm it, but they are just fishing in the hope that you'll bite.

In person, on your doorstep: anyone purporting to be from a bona fide service, e.g. Police, Utilities, will have ID on them. Ask to see it. And if they want to enter your property make sure you verify the ID with the service on the phone while the person waits outside.

In person, someone trying to sell you their services for your house/garden. Preferably, do not engage with them at all. If you need work doing, do your homework on local companies and ask friends/family/neighbours for recommendations.

Vehicle Thefts - from and of:

On the 19/06 a resident of Woodfield Avenue witnessed a male and female, very late at night, going onto their driveway and trying the door handle of their car – fortunately it was locked. The people involved in this are opportunist thieves, most likely drug addicts, who are roving around trying door handles

and if they find one open, they will search the car for anything valuable - cash or anything that they can sell. To avoid being a victim of this crime please ensure that you lock your car door, sometimes the central locking fob can be very sensitive and if you put it in your pocket after locking your car, it might accidently unlock so double check your car when you lock it and leave it completely empty of cash, and anything of value.

On the 09/06 another resident of Woodfield Avenue had three white men enter his driveway in the middle of the night and one was holding a device near his front door whilst the other was by his car trying to open his car door. These car thieves were in possession of signal boosters that boost the signal from your car key to your car, which can then unlock and steal your car. To combat this keep your car key in a Faraday pouch which contains the signal within the pouch. People who have high value new cars still keep their car kevs in their kitchen or in the hallway not in one of these pouches, don't be surprised if your car goes missing if you do not take this security measure.

Road Rage incidents and dash cams:

Not that long ago a resident of the Sudbury Court Estate was calmly driving her car on a narrow stretch of road when an aggressive male driver came up behind her, hooted his horn, and continued to drive right up to her bumper: he later tried to undertake her on a single narrow carriageway. When he eventually over took her he pulled in directly in front of her, exited his car and proceeded to try to smash her car window. The aggression from him being unable to overtake her seemingly erupted into this unprovoked violent outburst. Fortunately, the window did not smash and other witnesses being nearby might have deterred him from trying to smash it again so he got into his car and sped off, leaving the other motorist in a state of shock.

No doubt this is probably not the first time this man has behaved in this manner. Despite investigation, trying to obtain CCTV in order to obtain this guy's registration number, attempts to locate him have been unsuccessful, which brings me onto a bit of advice about the benefits of a dash cam.

Following receipt of dash cam footage showing a road rage incident in late 2019, I successfully prosecuted a male for dangerous driving and a public order offence – he pleaded guilty at the first hearing because of the strength of the evidence. The dash cam footage was excellent evidence, very clear and unequivocal. So I would urge motorists to consider getting one, it can help us in incidents of road rage and collisions and some insurers offer reductions in premiums to motorists who use one.

Beggars:

From my experience, most beggars who were born in the UK, do it to finance an addiction—whether it be drink or drugs—but claim to be begging as they claim to be homeless. A minority of beggars are homeless, most likely through mental health issues, and resort to begging but as I say in the vast majority of times that I have dealt with beggars in Sudbury or around Kenton Sainsburys, Northwick Park Hospital or tube station, the beggars have been Class A drug addicts. I know that someone who gives

them money thinks they are helping them but are you helping them if you give money to fund their drug habit?

Also, where there are drug addicts the dealers won't be far away so by giving them money you are also encouraging dealers into the area. I would urge you not to give money to beggars for these reasons. You may well ask yourself if you don't give them money what will they do to finance their habit, maybe steal, most beggars who have drug addiction issues have quite an extensive criminal history and might resort to stealing, if they do they will probably get caught and alongside any prosecution will be referred to drug assessment/intervention programs and it could be their best hope of getting off the drugs.

Drug Dealing:

We, are getting complaints about drug dealing to Class A drug addicts in and around the alleyway behind the parade of shops on Kenton Road near Rushout Avenue. No doubt some of the addicts who are attending this area are financing their habit through



begging. We, have been working on this problem through patrols. On the 01/07 a female at this location was searched by PC Gardner and found to be in possession of Crack Cocaine and a small quantity of cannabis – she was subsequently charged with possession of these controlled drugs. We are working to identify the dealer but no doubt if this dealer disappears another will fill his shoes. Another addict who is suspected to have been frequenting the alleyway for drugs was evicted from her nearby address following SNT intervention.

Councillor's Comments

Good day to all.

At the time of writing England recently lost the final of Euro 2020.

Congratulations must go to Gareth Southgate and the England squad for getting to the final – and commiserations for losing out to Italy on penalties in extra time, we were hoping that it was coming home this time - but alas it was not to be!!. Best of luck to the England Team for next year's World Cup 2022.

It was good to see the crowds back at Wembley, but we must not be complacent, COVID-19 has not gone away and will very much be present throughout our daily lives.



Covid-19 update

The infection rates continue to rise and the seven day incidence rate is now 166

per 100,000 for Brent, 211 for London and 264 for England. PCR positivity rates are 4.9% locally, 5.8% for London and 7.7% for England.

Our highest rates locally are in those aged 11 to 24 years. However we are now seeing small increases in the over 25s. Fortunately COVID related hospital activity remains low. The highest rate of coronavirus cases in Brent are within the younger population and the working age group. In Brent, we continue to promote the coronavirus public health advice with our residents and where they are able to get coronavirus testing in the borough. We also now have the Vaccine bus, which is out and about in the borough five days a week, pop-up clinics and GP sites that are available across the borough and also the walk-in service at the mass vaccination site for our residents to be able to receive their coronavirus vaccine.

The data from 9th July 2021 indicates that

there has been a total of 58% who have taken the first dose of the vaccine and up to 40% of the second dose. Nationally the same figures are 87% and 65% respectively. This indicates that there is still a lot of hesitancy existing in the borough. Given that lockdown restrictions will be released on the 19th July, I would encourage that the best protection from COVID-19 is two doses of the vaccine to keep our communities safe as well as practising hands, face, space and fresh air. Please ensure that you proceed with caution as we try to go back to normal.

Footpath 36—Northwick Park Pavilion to Ducker

We have been receiving complaints about this footpath by neighbours who live close by. The footpath 36 is currently closed due to works to repair a water main, however a few hardy individuals have managed to pass the works and they report that the footpath is becoming heavily overgrown despite the works that had strangely been undertaken by the council to pave the footpath where the responsibility actually lies with Playgolf under the terms of their lease. We have raised this matter with Officers in the Council and we truly hope that they will take the necessary action to get this resolved and get Playgolf to keep the footpath clear.

Development at 231 Watford Road

There is a proposal to redevelop the site and build 42 new homes – with a mix of single and family accommodation. The scale of the heights will vary from five storeys moving down to storeys. Two consultation events happened in June and the feedback received by the consultation company will be taken on board by them we have been told. We have been hearing from residents and their views on this scheme. This is not yet a live planning application, but when it does become live we will let you know.

Brent Kickstart Scheme

The past year has been an incredibly difficult time for young people, especially those looking for work. As the country emerges from lockdown and the government's furlough scheme comes to an end, local employment is a real focus for Brent Council.

We need to get a message to Brent young people in need of job opportunities, who are:

☐ 16-24 years old;

□ and claiming Universal Credit.

Through Brent Works, we've linked up with 75 local businesses to create over 250 job placements and counting for Brent's young people. Work placements are 6 months, but the aim is to support progress into other opportunities at the end.

Brent's Kickstart Scheme is part of a £2 billion national programme. The idea is to create employment opportunities, boost young people's confidence, and prevent long gaps in employment which could hamper future job applications.

Not only has it been a creation for the community, it has created its own committed and bright community too, and an ever-expanding one.

The garden can be enjoyed by anyone, anytime and in any way. It is a place where I personally have found that I have spent many hours, walking my chocolate Labrador, making a new friend or two and worked hard gardening. Visitors have even harvested a variety of herbs, with many other edible plants suitable for harvesting in the future. The garden has brought me closer to nature and helped me make new friends. It also has a positive impact on the environment. All kinds of wildlife, from bees to butterflies, have been flocking in and flourishing with the variety of healthy plants around, many which have been donated by the community.

Not only is the garden a place to enjoy for those with a love for the outdoors, it has also proved effective in educating both adults and children alike with regards to nature, wildlife, biodiversity and for our very own gardening at home, all thanks to the help of our Permaculture expert Susannah Hall and the four devoted







trustees that started this project up.

Children from Byron Court Primary School and the nearby Scouts group have been enjoying the garden, socialising with friends, playing with dogs and learning about the world around them as well as getting stuck in with the gardening work that takes place. Scouts planted the Allium bulbs in 2019 – the pink/ white bloom is amazing! (See attached photo, also of Hollyhocks and Lavender)

During the various lockdowns, a smaller group (including me!) has braving the elements. through intense heat, rain or bitter cold to maintain the garden, protecting the plants with cardboard mulch and woodchip, watering, weeding and further planting. Not only has it done good for the environment, it has done a lot of good for us both mentally and physically, providing a space to relax and get away from the stresses of our everyday lives along with some much-needed exercise after being stuck indoors so much! This small group has also built strong bonds and friendships that will last for a long time. And the intention is that this will repeat for many vears to come."

Here Comes the Sun...

The summer sun is upon us and with the sunshine comes the risk of dehydration. Barbecues, beach trips, garden parties and picnics are what make summer so much fun and with the easing of restrictions, we may all get to enjoy these activities again this summer. However, it is important to note that too much outdoor time can also lead to dehydration which for some senior individuals can be a common cause of hospitalisation. Apart from drinking regularly there are other steps to prevent dehydration.

Tip1: Wear Breathable clothing

Tight synthetic materials can make you perspire a lot – wear light breathable layers such as cotton fabrics and linen.

Tip 2: Increase fluid intake

Drink as much as you can when it is extremely hot. Drink, water, tea and juice. Try squash in water if you do not like drinking water to encourage you to drink regularly.

Tip 3: Foods hydrate too

Leafy greens, celery, berries, melon, cucumber, tomatoes and apples can be added to the summer diet. These foods can be very refreshing.

Tip 4: Medication Review

Certain medications can increase the risk of dehydration and sensitivity to the sun – talk to your GP or pharmacists about any concerns.

Tip 5: Always use Sunscreen

It is really important whenever you are outside in the sunshine that you wear Sunscreen, our skin can be delicate, so we need to protect it from burning, even when it is overcast.

Tip 6: Stay Indoors during the hottest hours

The sun is more intense during the middle of the day, between 12pm-3pm so avoid being outside during these times. Do any outdoor activities such as gardening, shopping and walking in the mornings or early evenings.
