

## Northwick Park Safer Neighbourhood Team (SNT)

If you read the crime figures below you can see that we have only had one burglary and no robberies reported to us within the preceding month, the burglary isn't actually on our patch as Northwick Avenue isn't part of our remit since the ward boundary change.

The crime figures, or lack of, are really very good and I would like to say I know why, I honestly don't but maybe it is in some small part due to the vigilance of the residents in the area?

In any case, as summer continues please be cautious about leaving windows and doors opened even while you are in the house, or doing work on your gardens – an opportunist thief / burglar might see an open door or garage door, and access your house or garage while you aren't about/looking.

Residents leaving their windows open at night time for ventilation could be burgled by so called creeping burglar(s) who can climb up, get in through the open window while you are sleeping. This has happened in previous Summers so please be aware and take the appropriate security measures - if you have an alarm, set it on a partial set even at night time when you are in the house. Also, ensure your windows have a lock on them so they can only be opened so much – that they cannot be opened so far that a small thin person can get in.

Also, can you keep your porch locked even if you are inside the house, if someone is in your porch a passer-by might think that they are the lawful occupier and they are somewhat hidden from view – think about it, they could be inside your porch tampering with your front door without anyone seeing them. Keep your porch door locked!!

If you go away on holiday and your house

is unoccupied it may be vulnerable to being burgled. Visual indicators that a house is unoccupied are no car in the drive/ house in darkness. Reformed burglars have been surveyed about their tactics and asked if they saw two houses - one with a fitted burglar alarm and the other without, notwithstanding other features then they would target the one without. Also, please consider lights and radio on timer switches, ask a neighbour to park their car in your drive whilst you are away. Good locks on the windows and doors of your house, good perimeter fencing is also a given - it is your Ring style doorbells first line of defence. are advisable as well

The Met Police website has a host of information on crime prevention, in relation to burglary also but please check it out.

## Fatal Collision - Sudbury Court Drive:

**9/6/2023:** there was a fatal road traffic collision on Sudbury Court Drive between a car and a moped. Sadly, a young man died in the collision. This is subject to police investigation, however, I know that a number of residents have approached me about the layout of the Sudbury Court Drive and the gaps in the carriageway between the up section (John Lyon roundabout to Greenford Road) and the down section.

Ultimately, the change in the carriageway layout will be a council and highways department matter. I am liaising with our traffic department to see if the police can give any endorsement to this appeal by the residents to get the gaps closed.

#### Vehicle nuisance and ASB:

The SNT have received a number of complaints from local residents to do with

vehicles with modified exhausts, loud exhausts with kicks, racing in and around the Sudbury Court Estate and the park at night time. We are following up on the information in relation to the vehicles involved and sending warning letters with a view to prosecution. We are also liaising with the council and the parks department in relation to potentially installing temporary cameras and trying to get the park gate closed at night time/in the evening.

If we catch such nuisance vehicles or have evidence of them acting recklessly or being a nuisance then we will apply the full extent of the law in order to stop their activities and maintain the peace in the area. The drivers of vehicles can be issued warnings under the Anti-social behaviour legislation if they use their vehicle in a specific manner thereby causing anti-social behaviour – reckless or inconsiderate manner or off road driving. If, having been warned, the driver or vehicle is involved in a recurrence within a specific time frame then they can have their vehicle seized.

Please report, with evidence, any vehicles involved.

#### What has your team been up to?

**13/06** I arrested a male following a complaint that this man had been sexually

harassing a disabled woman. This is subject to an investigation and the male is on bail, he has been bailed out of this area whilst the investigation is ongoing.

14/06 whilst still topping and tailing with regard to the above case. I popped out to get lunch at Wenzels in Sudbury. On parking up my police car, I noticed a very thin gaunt young man loitering on the private stair case as you enter the service alleyway behind Wenzels. I was unhappy with his account of being there, he gave a name that was initially not coming up on our database. I was still unhappy with what he was saying and his insistence that he had never been arrested. Finally, the information he gave me told me his previous address and I then managed to find out his name, I found that he was wanted for an aggravated burglary of an address in Wembley. I arrested him, he was charged and remanded to court

**18/06** shortly after 4pm: PC Ryatt another colleague and I were driving up Blackbird Hill towards Wembley. We saw a group of masked youths near the BP, opposite the Church on Chalkhill Road. We had to U-turn by which time the group was running off in different directions, We managed to stop one of the youths and discovered, under a car that he was seen coming from, was a 34cm bladed machete-style knife. PC Ryatt arrested this youth who is currently on bail whilst further investigation takes place.

Though we looked around the area to see if there were other discarded weapons, nothing else was found. In the subsequent days, another machete was found on the grounds of the church, though I along with other officers had searched around there when the incident happened.

In the past year, I have been involved in three knife arrests—for me this is alarming—all involving young men, 16 years old.

Please be careful when you are out and about, and speak to your young sons, in particular, about the danger posed by those carrying knives.

In addition, to these incidents, your team has had some leave period.

Other issues your team are working on is the closure of another believed brothel in the area; ongoing issues of disturbance involving a woman with mental health issues in a block of flats – trying to get her support and treatment; ongoing issues of disturbance in another block involving a woman with drug addiction issues who is having a lot of addict visitors who are stealing residents' parcels.

We are still working on the group of youths who are suspected to be involved in drug dealing on East Lane and trespassing in private blocks of flats and causing a nuisance.

## Overview of offences 6th Jun—10<sup>th</sup> Jul:

**Burglary:** (i) Northwick Avenue (in 20s odds) 3/07 1315hrs – 07/07 1430hrs, forced entry via the front door whilst victim was away on holiday, house ransacked – cash and jewellery stolen.

**Theft of Motor Vehicle:** (i) Amery Road (in 30s odds) 22/06 2130hrs – 23/06 0630hrs, 2022 plate Lexus RXL stolen, it is believed keys were in a Faraday pouch; (ii) Paxford Road (in 100s odds) 30/06 0215hrs 2020 plate Land Rover Evoque stolen.

**Theft from Motor Vehicle:** (i) Kenton Road (in 50s odds) 1206 1900 – 13/06 0730, registration plates stolen from car. Even though this is not on Northwick Park ward since the boundary change, this still comes up on our crime figures publication. (ii) Peel Road (in

50s odds) 09/07 0630hrs spare wheel stolen from underneath 2022 plate VW Crafter, silver Vauxhall involved.

The reporting methods: 999 for an emergency situation – immediate risk to personal safety or that of property, if a suspect for a crime is still there and likelihood that police could effect an arrest (not always possible due to call volume). 101 for a non-emergency situation where a crime has been committed and the suspect no longer on scene or nearby, non-emergency incidents may also be reported online via the Met Police Website – www.met.police.uk



## SCRA—AGM Update - Pareet Shah, Chair

Hello everyone,

Summer is here! I hope you all manage to enjoy the sunshine and get some rest and relaxation over the coming weeks.

The committee met on 11<sup>th</sup> July and discussed several issues of interest to residents:

## 1. Mumbai Junction planning application.

Just before our committee meeting, we learnt that this locally unpopular planning application which had been due to be discussed by the council's planning committee the following day (12<sup>th</sup> July) had been deferred to a future date. No reason has been given for this deferral at time of writing—we will update you when we learn more about this.

#### 2. Fatal road collision.

Many of you may be aware that, tragically, there was a fatal road collision on Sudbury Court Drive in June. A motorcycle rider collided with a car driver and sadly died from

their injuries. The circumstances surrounding this incident are not yet available to the public, however, once they are known we hope to meet with the council to look at measures to prevent such an incident from recurring.

## 3. Front garden competition.

The Sudbury Court Horticultural Society committee have again kindly volunteered to judge the front garden competition this summer. They plan to visit nominated gardens on 13<sup>th</sup> August. There will be prizes for 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> best gardens. ## 4. Barham Park Cottages development.

This controversial planning application was approved on 12<sup>th</sup> June, to much local disappointment. The committee is supporting residents to pursue other avenues to stop this development and more details will be shared in due course.

Anne Victoria Gander, one of the oldest residents living on the Sudbury Court Estate, died on 23 June 2023.

At 97 years old Anne, had lived here since 1976 and was well known to many as "Aunty Anne".

This name was used by all the school children who attended Byron Court School when she worked there. Anne would help children with their reading, spelling and writing free of charge.

Anne would sit on the garden wall or the steps going up to her front door and chat with old and young passing by.

A devout church goer, Anne was very popular with her neighbours. She helped with the organising and taking part in activities for the

senior citizens of our estate for many years. When the previous Vicar, Reverend Steve, introduced the idea of a Memory Cafe at St Cuthberts, Anne took on the responsibility of not only organising the games, sing song sessions etc. but took on the responsibility of running the show.

Anne wrote poetry (see below) and words flowed out of her very easily. Instead of sending cards to friends and family, she would pen a poem specially for them which even the poet laureates perhaps have difficulty doing.

Anne's funeral was well attended and tributes were paid by various people. She will be missed by all of us and we join in sending our condolences to her daughter, Jane Edwards and son, John Gander. May she rest in peace.

July was a wonderful month for potential new opportunities and connections for the Community Garden and the volunteers and graduates of our Permaculture Design Course which finished at the end of May.

We were active participants at the Permaculture Festival at the beautiful Cecil Sharp House on 2<sup>nd</sup> July. The roles between us included organising, staffing the marketplace on the plant

and information stalls, and speaking about living well in small spaces. The cost of a stall at the festival is just a couple of cakes which are sold on the cake stall to raise funds

Permaculture is not just about gardening and growing but also about sustainability and earth care. In the marketplace we also ran a micro workshop for attendees to naturally dye their own silk scarf using botanical dyes which complemented the fascinating talk that day by Zoe Burt and Jahmale on sustainable and creative ways to refashion clothing.

We were able to talk to so many interesting people many of who we had met the previous year including Calthorpe Community Garden, Josiah Braithwaite Community Garden and Hackney Herbal. We now feel that we are strongly embedded in the Permaculture network and community. Look out for next year's festival which we will advertise on our social media.

The following day we participated in an RHS afternoon discussion about the benefits of volunteering. This information will lead to a resource area for community groups on their website. It was lovely to hear from so many people who were involved in community gardening groups, and cake was often an answer in many situations. It took place



at the Hampton Court Flower Show, and we were privileged to be able to arrive early and explore the show a day before it opened to the public. The standout plant for us was Eryngium (Sea Holly) "Big Blue" as it was always smothered in Honeybees and the standout garden was designed by Carol Klein whose principles were to work with nature and to use swathes of plants. We had also been invited to consider

submitting a design for an allotment so took the opportunity to look at this year's fabulous allotment gardens and talk to the designers . . . Watch this space it seemed very possible!


