Burglars arrested: Sunday July 16th – burglary at an address on Oldborough Road (in 20s odds) at about 1500hrs.

At about this time, a resident on this road heard loud banging on his front door and, as he wasn't expecting anyone he didn't answer, instead looked out from an upstairs window. He saw a group of young men—they put masks on and jumped over to the back garden, accessed his garage which he had left open as he had been doing work in it. The resident rang 999. The group have then tried to gain entry to his house, at which point they saw him and fled over a number of gardens. Two youths, believed to be from this group, were apprehended sometime later on the Sudbury Court Estate after a police pursuit, involving police dogs.

Believed linked to this is a report from a resident of Audrey Gardens at 1420hrs who saw some youths looking through their neighbour's porch: when quizzed by this witness they said that there was something wrong with the neighbour's guttering and then went off towards Abbotts Drive.

These incidents serve to highlight that burglars often knock at the front door/porch to see if there is anyone at home before they then go on to try to burgle.

Unfortunately, the two arrested youths have had to be bailed on 17/07/23 pending further investigation.

Car thief arrested: Tuesday August 1st at about 0325hrs a resident of Paxford Road rang 999 reporting that someone was trying to steal a car: a Lexus. Four males involved.

Fortunately, there were available police units and police cars made their way. On East Lane one police unit heading to Paxford Road passed a Lexus car which turned into Tesco on East Lane, possibly to evade police

There was a male in the driver's seat of the stolen Lexus, who was then arrested. He was subsequently interviewed, charged with a number of offences including Theft of Motor Vehicle, Going Equipped and driving offences. He was remanded in custody to court and remanded for trial. The other three from the group are outstanding. The Lexus was a 2020 plate Nx 300h F Sport.

18/05 at 0230hrs a 2016 Mercedes AMG C 63 was stolen from Priory Crescent, the car remains outstanding. On the 30/07 at 0342hrs the same resident had seen suspected thieves on mopeds snooping around this area of his road believed with the intent to steal his replacement car. Please be aware and please ring 999 if you believe someone is about to steal a car.

05/08 at 0344hrs a masked white man with a backpack and another male entered the driveway of an address in Pebworth Road. The male with the backpack was seen using a scanner near the house, the other male managed to get into the 2018 Mercedes parked on the drive, fortunately in this instance, the males didn't manage to steal the car.

Please be aware if you have a new keyless entry car; please keep your key in a Faraday Pouch, use a substantial steering/crook lock at all times when parked up unattended, consider installing a gate on your driveway.

Rogue Builders: Late July, a resident witnessed an interaction between some male builders and the occupiers of an address in the Sudbury Court Estate and rang police about the men, suspecting them to be rogue builders.

Police attended the address and following enquiries with the occupants confirmed that the working practices of this group were indeed rogue in nature. The occupier was advised

advised accordingly. It was confirmed with the occupant that these "builders" who were contracted to do some work on the chimney had been found through a website. Remember the old adage – paper never refuses ink! In other words, don't believe everything you read.

If you need some work done on your property, please ask friends, family or neighbours for recommendations of builders who have personally worked for them and that their work has stood the test of time. Most reputable builders have a huge wait list so be prepared to wait.

Vehicle nuisance and ASB: We have received a number of complaints from local residents concerning vehicles with modified exhausts, loud exhausts with kicks, racing in and around the Sudbury Court Estate and the park at night time. We are following up on the information in relation to the vehicles involved and sending warning letters with a view to prosecution. We are also liaising with the Council and the Parks Department in relation to potentially installing temporary cameras and trying to get the park gate closed at night/in the evening.

If we catch such nuisance vehicles, or have evidence of them acting recklessly or being a nuisance then we will apply the full extent of the law in order to stop their activities and maintain the peace in the area. The drivers of vehicles can be issued warnings under the Anti-Social Behaviour legislation if they use their vehicle in a specific manner thereby causing anti-social behaviour — reckless or inconsiderate manner or off-road driving. If, having been warned, the driver or vehicle is involved in a recurrence within a specific timeframe then they can have their

vehicle seized. Please report, with evidence, any vehicles involved.

What has your team been up to?

We are working on a number of ongoing issues including ASB in relation to drug dealing (East Lane), a suspected crack house (Perrin Road) and a brothel in a road off East Lane, being some of the issues that we are busy with currently.

23/07 whilst on patrol in Rushout Avenue, I saw a male who I knew to be wanted for a burglary. The male, a drug addict, was arrested by PC Ryatt for this burglary. He is currently on remand awaiting sentencing for this offence.

Ongoing Issues:

Parking Scam: In the Wembley Central and Ealing Road area a number of elderly residents have been scammed by males with hand card readers, or being walked to cashpoints, for being "fined for illegal parking". The males involved in this can look quite presentable but will not have a uniform like local authority enforcement officers.

DO NOT give them your card details or cash.

If you receive a legitimate fine for parking illegally, an Enforcement Notice will be put on your vehicle windscreen for you to pay at a later date or appeal the fine— e.g. if it is a Brent Council or local authority fine, the notice will include full and clear information on how to pay or appeal your fine within a number of days— it will never involve immediate payment to a person.

In previous years, a resident was scammed in this manner when he parked in a Cash and Carry car park near Sainsbury's Kenton Road

Theft of and from vehicles:

There are ongoing reports of high value cars being stolen late at night or in the wee hours by thieves using specialist equipment, radio frequency scanners and the like. To combat this it is advisable that you keep your key in a Faraday pouch and also put a good steering lock on your car.

From time to time and within the past month a resident has contacted us regarding their CCTV that picked up a thief trying door handles of cars in the middle of the night – from my experience these sort of opportunistic thieves that roam around on foot in the middle of the night tend to be people with addiction issues and are looking for an open door in the hope of finding anything to sell (sunglasses in glove compartment) or some loose change. To combat this please keep your car clear of anything of value and leave your glove compartment open and empty of anything of value.

Please be aware that Blue Badges are highly sought after so, when not in a restricted area, it is advisable that you don't leave it visible in your car or in your car at all if possible.

Attempted Theft of Motor Vehicle: (i) The Fairway (low odds) 21/07 1835hrs two males in a white Ford Mondeo apparently trying to open doors of a 2017 plate Prius, believed in an attempt to steal the car.

Theft from Motor Vehicle: (i) Sudbury Court Road (in 30s odds) 11/07 2100hrs – 12/07 0500hrs items stolen from a 2006 Astra, no damaged caused, believed car not locked; (ii) Littleton Road (in 30s evens) 13/07 1400hrs – 14/07 2100hrs registration plate stolen from 2018 BMW car.



Everyone produced beautiful, individual pieces, which they took home to enjoy. Add to your food to increase energy without increasing portion size.

What is a fortified diet?

A fortified diet describes meals, snacks and drinks which have had additional high calorie and protein foods added to them, e.g. cream, milk and butter. This helps to prevent weight loss, improve energy intake and maximises the nutritional content of a dish so that every mouthful counts.



Use full fat milk/cream - make milkshakes or use in teas, coffees, soups and puddings.



Whisk 2-4 tablespoons of dried skimmed milk powder into a pint of milk.



Add butter, margarine, cream or cheese to dishes, e.g. potatoes.



Add cooked meat, fish, beans and other pulses to soups and sauces.



Add honey, chopped nuts or dried fruit to puddings, cereals or porridge.
